Preliminary Investigation: KING KONG (alias) Christiaan LINDEMANS

REASON FOR INVESTIGATION

Telegrams received from the agent BOESCHOTEN gave reason to believe that K.K. might have been very closely involved in the arrest of that agent, the more so since, in one of the telegrams, there appeared a name (corrupt) which was apparently that of K.K.'s woman, ILIV LESTER. I remember that this name was used in connection with the return home in a drunken condition of the agent SEYSEN (SCHOTEN) with a suspicious girl.

Further, there were telegrams which also aroused suspicion of LINDEMANS, in which mention was made of the Raad van Verzet (Resistance Council) in Belgium, which was to be under the leadership of KING KONG. This telegram arrived shortly after KING KONG was arrested by the Gestapo and an attempt to rescue him, organized by BOESCHOTEN, had failed (this according to information from BOESCHOTEN). Thus an escape by KING KONG appeared completely impossible. The subsequent report that he was free again and was even to lead an organization called the R.v.V. in Belgium, was thus, no to speak, the clearest possible evidence of Gestapo provocation.

SEYSEN was the first agent who was arrested (after the drunken escapade).

INVESTIGATION

About 3 weeks ago, a young lady who had left Brussels with a special mission, having been sent by Commander JOHNS (without consultation with us), reported to us. Her mission was to go through the enemy's lines in order to contact certain members of the Resistance in the Netherlands. She reported to us with the information that her chauffeur, a chief of the Secret Army (A.S.) had been shot by the frontier guards of the White Brigade because he was taken for a German, and that, as the enemy control was growing even more strict, she saw no chance of getting away through the lines.

When I asked her, in surprise, who had sent her, it appeared that Cdr. JOHNS had entrusted her with her mission. Her particulars are as follows:

Her father owned a seedman's business at Enkhuizen (Family A. ZWAAN), a branch of which was opened in Belgium in 1926. In that year, Ellie ZWAAN went with her family to Belgium and settled there, while the seed business in Holland was taken over by her uncle. The seedshop in Belgium is at Brual 95, Malines. It is called 'Dutch Seedshop'.

When I questioned Ellie about her contacts, it appeared that she was in close touch with Christiaan LINDEMANS, and that she planned to contact C.L. alias KING KONG, and his assistants in Holland. In consequence of the very suspicious facts known to me, I forbade her to go and let her stay in a small hotel in Dicot, so as to have the opportunity to question her more closely about K.K.

In the meantime, I got in touch with Cdr. JOHNS, to learn why he had sent her without consultation with the Prince's R.Q. It seemed that Cdr. JOHNS had had no choice, that it was a case of speed, and that he had despatched Ellie with no other mission than to send a member of the R.v.V. as a messenger to the Prince.

Points from my conversations with K.K. which I passed on, in the meantime, to H.I. 9., for whom he worked.

X CHRIS knew HARRY (agent) friend of BOB from Limburg, uneducated speech, lived Kortenaarstraat 6, Rotterdam. X According to description, this is SPYGLI. This man was in contact with a girl named Ellie van der WEGE (Langevliet 23, Rotterdam). She seems to be a Gestapo agent; she betrayed CHRIS as well as HARRY. It is noteworthy that the number of letters in her Christian name coincides with that of GILOU; thus, the corrupt name of the girl who returned home with the incognito SCHOUTEN might also have been that of Ellie.

HARRY was run in on a Sunday, while 2 days later, CHRIS was caught in the Divisionschutz building, where he was seeking information about the arrested HARRY from Ellie (v.d.W.). He was taken to the hospital at Zuidwal, Rotterdam, where he had an opportunity to send a message to BOB through Roelof van der HAGE, alias van den BERG, Rotterdam, Noordzinsel (son of Dr. van der HAGE). BOB (BOESCHOTEN) arranged a raid, which miscarried because K.K. was just on the operating table. He was afterwards taken to the Catholic hospital at Scheveningen. Then, when K.K. had been there 4 days, BOB suddenly stood in front of him with members of the Resistance. K.K. was set free and brought to Rotterdam.

One day, R. van der HAGE came to say that a pension in which he had

lived had been 'attended to' by the Gestapo.

BOB's arrest took place at Jokerstraat, Amsterdam. The Sicherheitsdienst had been there for at least 4 days, and had arrested every person who called. HARRY was the first to be arrested, later many others who came to that address, but people were also rounded up as a result of the grilling of Resistance members who had previously been caught. 'Witte BOB' ('White BOB') (W/T) was arrested in the same way, and that when he was in the act of transmitting (lit. signalling) from the home of the RAMSD family (Baroness de BEAUFORT).

TONI was arrested in an Amsterdam brothel where there were also Germans present.

When 'Zwarte BOB' ('Black BOB') was arrested, the Gestapo found all the stuff at his home. According to K.K., this included 4 transmitting sets, one of which was not in use (? as Dutch text corrupt).

One of the leaders of the 'Trouw' (Trust) Resistance Group, namely DIK, was arrested with him at the same time. During the subsequent gun-battle, this man was shot in the stomach.

K.K. knew that BOB had the addresses of many contacts in Utrecht - among others, addresses connected with the Food Control.

According to K.K., he recruited the many Dutch Resistance members who were working with him on the R.V.V. for (work in) Belgium, under the leadership of KIM KONG. These men are now being contacted by us and are being sent to Eindhoven, where they will be put into uniform and possibly used for penetration as a flying brigade.

LINDEMANS knew that a member of the White Brigade (De KONINCK) had many carrier-pigeons in his possession, which, it is possible, had been offered for the use of De CHRISTOPHOOR at that time.

K.K. cannot remember with certainty how long it was after he himself had been set free that BOB was arrested.

After having talked with Chris LINDEMANS for a long time, I have come to the conclusion that he cannot distinguish right from wrong (lit. does not decide what is a mistake). He is and always will be, slightly fantastic, and I am firmly convinced that the anti-social element in his psychological make-up disturbs the balance of his mind.

He has always been accepted as 100% (trustworthy) by the Belgian and French organizations. He received the warmest recommendation from the M.H.B., the White Brigade, and the H.C. of the A.S., Groenplaats, Antwerp. He must always remain under someone's command and should on no account be given authority over a group. O.K. as subordinate officer.

26 MAY 1955

According to Ellie ZWAAN, the following were present when Christiaan LINDEMANS was set free: X Jan LINDEMANS and ROELTJE. The latter was also there at the Vught raid, when he was machine-gunned in the stomach and was arrested. He was shot at Vught in July or August.

I have discussed the whole affair with Major FINTO, who also instituted an enquiry and brought about the arrest of ANKE, after which he gave her a 'Finto-ing'. She is now free again.

I checked up on Ellie ZWAAN through my own personal contacts in Antwerp. She is 100% (trustworthy), and has done much good work. She furnished LINDEMANS with, amongst other things, large sums of money for the support of his organization.

16. It was during this stay in Brussels that source came into contact with Chris LINDEMAN alias KING KONG. (An account of this contact is given as separate Appendix.)

CONCLUSION.

29. At the opening of the present interrogation, source adopted an obstinate attitude. He said that he knew he was an enemy agent, that he probably would be shot, but that he had information of the greatest leakage that had ever taken place. This information he would give us only on one condition, namely: that he worked for us. However, it was made clear to him that he had no conditions to make and that he was to answer questions put to him, which he did.

30. The leakage referred to was that of Chris LINDEMAN alias KING KONG, who had been appointed by Prince Bernhard of the Netherlands to be his liaison with the Dutch Forces of the Interior. Immediate action was taken on his information, which is given here in the form of source's statement in Appendix B. As a result of this, KING KONG and his companion, GOORDE alias JANSINK, have now been arrested and await interrogation. GOORDE, it may be noted, was the subject of a case brought to M.I.5's notice in the U.K. He has been guilty of indiscretion in the past, but, so far, we have had no evidence of treachery on his part. It remains to be seen whether his connection with KING KONG is a subversive one.

APPENDIX D. 2

TRANSLATION of STATEMENT by source concerning KING KONG.

In the beginning of Mar 44 I was introduced in the Grande Hotel Boulevard, Brussels to Christian LINDEMANN living in Rotterdam, who was anxious to work for the German Abwehr, by a N.S.B. member, Willy van ~~WESSENER~~ of Leiden. C.O. or C.C. as he is known to the German Abwehr, had ~~WESSENER~~ imprisoned in the Scheveningen prison for helping English people to escape from Holland.

C.O. wanted to meet the head of the German Abwehr and was willing to tell him everything he knew on condition that his brother was set free.

I travelled to Holland and 24 hours later the head of the German Abwehr (III F) came to Brussels, and a meeting was held in a villa outside Brussels which lasted the whole night. C.C. declared that he knew all the British and resistance movements in Holland, Belgium, France and Spain. He produced a German pay book, "Gouzenpensing" and all the stamps of the Wehrmacht and travelling tickets.

After he had obtained the word of honour of Lt. Col. GIESSENS (alias Dr. GERHARD) that his brother would be set free, he telephoned various British agents in Brussels and made appointments for the following week, chiefly in churches and cafes. This took place under the personal direction of Dr. GIESSENS' assistants, Willy KUF alias ZAIN, and ARNAUDS, who had been in the German Foreign Legion. ^{RF 602, 160} ^{RF 600, 67}

C.O. said that he had worked for the British Service in Rotterdam since 1938. During the time he was working for the German Abwehr, he always succeeded between his conferences with British agents and internal groups in contacting and passing reports to one of the German Abwehr workers. In this way, many people in Paris, Bordeaux, and Hendaye were arrested. Also in Amsterdam, the C.S. VI organisation, in Leiden, Rotterdam and The Hague were also arrested, but an entire group was never arrested, a few being allowed to remain in order that they could be watched.

In The Hague or Rotterdam he was attacked by an S.D. officer and shot in the chest. The S.D. or Gestapo neither knew nor were to know that C.O. was working for the Abwehr. If C.O. got into trouble, he had to telephone the Befehlshaber der Niederlanden and ask for Dr. VOLLER.

With the connivance of Dr. GIESSENS, he was taken to a hospital, as it was presumed that an attempt would be made to free him, and, as a result, 47 men were arrested. (KING KONG betrayed his rescuers the same evening).

Now and then, espionage material or a single British pilot, was allowed to pass through, in order to dispel suspicion. Good material was withheld, chiefly micro films from Germany and Holland.

In Belgium he betrayed an entire group of British agents. ^{DECEASED} ^{26 MAY 1953}

In Belgium he had an affair with Elly ZWAAN, daughter of one of the leaders of the Witte Brigade, and, in order to see her, he travelled between Mechelen Antwerp Brussels Luik and the Ardennes. He also travelled a good deal in order to transport weapons and other material, followed always by German police personnel, who then made arrests without suspicion falling on him.

The total number of men arrested through him is 267.

It is now about 4 weeks since C.O. came in the night and in turn

I do not remember anything else.

G.C. would never have done this, had he not been in a highly nervous state caused by anxiety about his brother.

G.C. told me that he had already taken many English and American pilots to Spain. Also led various convoys to the Ardennes. In Lille he had collaborated with the Australian Major AUSTIN of the I.S. who lived opposite the G.M.P. In Holland he was being sought by the S.D. for illegal work.

He betrayed also the man who made all the stamps in Holland, a book dealer, living in Baarn, and also a Swiss in Rotterdam who manufactured all the false German papers in a water-distillery.

G.C. was ordered to shoot v.d. BERG dead but he would not commit a murder.

Note on LINDEMANS case on 8.11.44

13 MAY 1955

LINDEMANS is a man who has been known to us since the late Autumn of 1943 when he came to notice as a result of information obtained from escapees passing through the L.R.C. He was a link in Paris of an escape route which passed Dutchmen out of Holland into the peninsula. That the escape route was hopelessly penetrated as a result of the activities of a certain LOWRY BALL, who appears to have been working, allegedly with other Dutchmen, on behalf of Hauptsturmfuehrer STUBBS of the S.D. at Toulouse, is clear. BALL worked in conjunction with a certain CHARRIER (or SCHARREN) in Holland who provided would-be escapees with S.D. documents by the S.D. in Toulouse. Whether LINDEMANS was at that time working for the Germans in penetrating this route, or whether at that time he was a loyal Dutchman performing services for the Allies, has not yet been established. It is to be observed, however, that LOWRY BALL was known to LINDEMANS and was at the same time apparently well known to be in the pay of the enemy. Kaas de GRAAF (who, it is presumed, is identical with the character of that name who has been mentioned by LINDEMANS and from whom possibly Mr. Pinto had been given the information regarding LINDEMANS on which he advised against LINDEMANS appointment in the post which he held at the time of his arrest) escaped over the route concerned. He at any rate appears to have had no doubt in his mind that BALL was working for the Germans. In fact it is from him that the name of Hauptsturmfuehrer STUBBS was obtained at the L.R.C. Furthermore de GRAAF, when he reached Paris with a man called CELOSSE, was contacted by Albert STARING at the instance of BALL, and STARING handed the two men over to LINDEMANS. This happened about the middle of December 1943.

LINDEMANS does not admit at present that he was working for the Germans prior to the Spring of this year. He originally stated that his first contact dated from the end of May or beginning of June. He has now associated it to April 1944 when he made contact with Wim Van Der MEER who is already known to us from the DAMEN case. He was then introduced to VERLOOP, now in the hands of the Allies, and he admits in general terms the allegations made by VERLOOP regarding his denunciations and betrayals of loyalists during the ensuing months, work done under the direction of a certain LE GERMAN working through his assistant whom LINDEMANS refers to as WILLY (not to be confused with WILLY or WIM Van Der MEER).

LINDEMANS admits that subsequently he received instructions to obtain operational information for the Germans. Following the relief of Brussels, he crossed the lines into enemy-held territory on about 20th September, when he made contact with the German Intelligence while on a mission under the directions of Captain BAKER. He then received instructions from ARNAUD (who is no doubt identical with the character of that name who passed DAMEN across the lines and who was well known to us as a penetrator of Allied Escape routes) to report back as soon as possible. He in fact stayed in Bindhoven until the arrival of the British troops. So far LINDEMANS has not admitted any subsequent contact with the enemy. S.I.S. has information which indicates that LINDEMANS has not told the truth regarding his activities during this period. He admits receiving instructions regarding operational information to be obtained but has at present given no particulars of operational information supplied.

Of the persons so far mentioned by LINDEMANS as German Secret Service contacts, in addition to ARNAUD who is commented on above, ~~VERBETTER~~, ~~GLISSENS~~, ~~MUPP & SALEM~~, ~~VAN DER MEER~~ and ~~VAN DER BEEK~~ have been described by ~~himself~~. ~~Captain JACKSON~~ may well be identical with Prosper DE ZITTER, who has been notorious over a long period for his activities in Belgium against loyal organisations as a penetrator and informer. ~~Mrs MEERSMAN~~ may well be identical with a certain MIA, a Javanese woman, reported to be a German agent and courier in October 1939, and arrested by the Dutch in December of the same year. She was said to come from the family of the Sultan DYONJAKARTIA and speaks several Oriental languages. Van BEUNINGEN, owner of the large Chateau near Hertogenbosch to which LINDEMANS was taken when he crossed the lines to Eindhoven, is probably identical with D.G. van BEUNINGEN who has been described as at one time being the "Rockefeller of Holland". Van BEUNINGEN was reported on by a refugee in May 1940 as having been an active member of the "Dutch National Socialist Union". Later in August 1942 his brothers were described as pro-Nazi in sympathies, but to conceal their activities they were stated to have subscribed not only to the Nazi Party but also to the Liberal Party. He was also mentioned in an intercepted letter in 1941 as living on an estate on the Dutch border. A friend of the writer of the letter had indicated that Van BEUNINGEN had been "playing ball" with the Germans to the fullest extent. These reports are, however, of wholly unknown reliability.

Owing to LINDEMANS' mental condition, the investigation is proving one of the most difficult that Camp 020 have ever been called upon to deal with. It is not expected that it will be possible to take it much further until the arrival of VERLOOP.

TRANSLATION OF CONFESSION SUBMITTED
BY LINDEMANS on 6.11.44

1. My first contact with the German Secret Service was in April 1944. Willy V. G. NELLE told me that he would put me in touch with the Abwehr. In May 1944, WILLY and NELLE took me to the Villa on the way to Waterloo.

Of my own free will I offered to give the Germans information on my activities in connection with the resistance movement in exchange for the release of my wife and brother. I told my whole story to GERMAN and VOGLER, and showed them my Soldbuch and other personal papers. p. 601, 712
2. Then, following WILLY's orders, I contacted a great many members of the Resistance movement and in their turn the Germans were able to get into touch with these people.
3. I also gave information on several Resistance groups, in particular those of Rotterdam and O.T.
4. In May 1944 I received a bullet wound in the chest from the Gestapo in Rotterdam, and was taken to hospital by the police. Two days later a German in civilian clothes, a 'commissaire' came to tell me that I must carry on working for the Germans. He told me to get into touch with my friends through my nurses so that they could help me to escape. I obeyed these instructions.
5. In May 1944 I gave the Germans information on various Englishmen that I had passed across the Spanish frontier.

First Contact.

LINDEMANS now gives the date of his first contact with Wim van der ~~WERR~~ April 1944.

At this meeting the question of the release of LINDEMANS' wife and brother was discussed and WIM stated that he could probably help in this matter. The sum of 10,000 Florins was mentioned as the price, but on LINDEMANS' saying that he had not got such a sum, WIM suggested that it might be arranged if LINDEMANS were willing to work for the German I.S.

LINDEMANS agreed to this last suggestion and a further rendezvous was fixed up with WIM, at a cafe near the Jardin Botanique. This time WIM was accompanied by another man (with his little finger missing) called WILLY BAKKER. This man, after threatening LINDEMANS, arranged to pick him up in a car a few days later and take him along to introduce him to the head of the German I.S.

The meeting duly took place at a villa on the Waterloo Road and LINDEMANS was introduced first to Dr. VOGLER, then to Dr. GERMAN. The latter told him that they knew all about his record of work for the Resistance Group and that his one hope of salvation was to work for the Germans. LINDEMANS agreed to work for the German I.S. and stated that he knew all the Allied escape routes in France, Belgium, Holland and Spain. Later Dr. GERMAN promised LINDEMANS that his wife and brother would be released. On this occasion LINDEMANS was in possession of a Soldbuch, laissez-passer and all his personal papers.

Payments.

No definite dates could be established, but it would appear they were roughly as follows:-

- First payment. About a fortnight after LINDEMANS started work for the German I.S. Sum received 5,000 francs. Paid by WILLY in his private apartment on the third or fourth floor at the Hotel Metropole, Brussels. Receipt signed CHRISTIAN.
- Second Payment. Some ten days later. 1,000 francs paid by WILLY in a cafe near the Place Rogier.

Subsequent payments were received of 5,000, 10,000 and odd sums of 500, 1,000 and 2,000 francs at a time.

The sum of 10,000 francs mentioned above was given to LINDEMANS to buy clothes. The greater portion of this sum, however, he states he gave to the Resistance Group.

Spy Name.

Never known as a V-Mann - only as CHRISTIAN or BRAND.

General Activities.

All meetings were arranged by telephone with either WILLY or WIM. LINDEMANS was given four separate telephone numbers. Meetings usually took place in cafes two or three times a week and were usually with WILLY and VOGLER.

Following WILLY's orders, LINDEMANS contacted a great many members of the Resistance Movement at various cafes, e.g. Cafe Tonneau, Antwerp, La Vierge (?) and Maison de Lopez, thus disclosing their whereabouts to the Germans. LINDEMANS also gave the Germans information on various Resistance Groups, particularly those of Amsterdam, Rotterdam and C.T.

In May 1944, in Rotterdam, LINDEMANS was shot through the chest, in a raid carried out by the Gestapo. He was taken by the Dutch Police to a hospital, and later was contacted by an unknown German, reported to be a Commissaire, in civilian clothes. This man told LINDEMANS that he must go on working for the German I.S. and instructed him to get in touch with all his friends through his nurse and fix up his escape from hospital. This was duly arranged with the full knowledge of the Germans, and the plan carried out. Many of his friends were arrested, although LINDEMANS disclaims all knowledge of this.

In the latter part of August, LINDEMANS made many trips between Brussels and Antwerp in order to try and find out where the Chief of the Resistance Group at Antwerp, Commandant REMER, was. On many occasions he contacted Commandant George ANSTAEK and POLY but was always told they had no news of the Chief.

Proposed Journey to the Ardennes.

LINDEMANS states that on one occasion (Approx. 20th August) Commandant ANSTAEK asked him to make him (ANSTAEK) out a false pass for his motor cycle to enable him to get to the Ardennes. LINDEMANS was in possession of many false rubber stamps and provided passes for the Resistance Group. LINDEMANS gave ANSTAEK this pass, whereupon the latter asked him to accompany him to the Ardennes, as ANSTAEK did not speak German and he might be able to help him.

LINDEMANS, when in Brussels, was always shadowed by WIM. He was, however, able to take out this pass at night without WIM knowing. LINDEMANS had to inform GERMAN of all his movements and on hearing that LINDEMANS wanted to go to Liège, was told by WILLY to find out the following:-

- (a) To find out the exact date and place of invasion of Belgium,
- (b) Whether the attack was coming from the sea, or by airborne troops,
- (c) Whether there were any parachutists in the area Liège-Dinant.

The Germans were anxious to obtain information about the bridges on the Meuse, particularly the main bridge at Dinant, and to find out whether British airborne troops could land near this river. LINDEMANS was also to try and find out what the Resistance Forces had orders to do in support of this possible attack.

LINDEMANS stayed in Brussels for two days and then moved to Malines, to the GRANDS. Here he was contacted by WIM and told to return immediately to Brussels. WILLY was very angry with him for not having carried out his mission to Liège. On his return to Brussels, he was ordered to return to Antwerp with WIM and to find out at all costs the whereabouts of Commandant REMER. LINDEMANS states that he and WIM met ANSTAEK at the Cafe Tonneau, but got no information. Daily visits were carried out without success, until eventually Brussels was

relieved by the Allied Troops.

Visits to Eindhoven.

LINDEMANS is again very vague about dates, but states that he went to Eindhoven on three occasions as follows:-

- 1) The first time, as given in Progress Report of 5th November 1944. The date, however, would appear to be about the 20th September and not the beginning of October, as previously stated.

On being sent back by the German H.Q. at Driebergen to Eindhoven (Approx. 21st September) he was told by ARBE to report back as soon as possible. He was to find out what sabotage had been carried out by agents in the Brussels area. He was not told to find out the location of any British H.Q. LINDEMANS states that he in fact stayed in Eindhoven until the arrival of the British troops. PF 60967

- 2) To take the W/T operator of Prince BERNHARD to Eindhoven, but as the station was not yet organised, he returned again to the Chateau de Rubens (120 miles from Eindhoven), the H.Q. of Prince BERNHARD. (Date approx. 15th or 16th October).
- 3) When sent up by Prince BERNHARD to talk with PETER, Chief of the Resistance Group at Eindhoven. LINDEMANS returned the same evening. (Date approx. 21st October).

His other contacts at Eindhoven were Captain de JUNGE and de ERNAF (T Kas van EVERDEWEGE), and de BEAUFORT.

Last Contact with German I.S.

[NELLYS & RAYNER] extra dit at 29a Beginning July 1944.

[WILLY] PF 601712 Approx. 1st September 1944. Just before the Allies entered Brussels.

On 22nd August, Oberstleutnant GISKES, ^{PR 601, 711} then head of Kdo. 307 (probably head of Abteilung III, BRUSSELS 1942-44) sent a message from Cologne to Oberstleutnant REILE, Head of Abteilung III at the PARIS station, which by this time had moved to St. Menchould. This message was in fact a report on Allied intentions from a source described as "a proven agent, C.O. of Kdo. 307," and was to the effect that on 12th-15th August there had been a meeting at Liege of the leaders of the A.B.S. Movement, which V-Mann C.O. was to have attended, but failed to do so owing to a motor accident on his way to Liege. However, C.O. on 21st August had a meeting with three English officers, including an officer sent to direct armed risings in Belgium who had arrived in Belgium on August 8th with full powers to take over the A.B.S. Movement. At this meeting on 21st August, the A.B.S. leaders were informed of the Allied plan of action, which was to despatch all agents who could be spared to the Maas line, where they would be assembled at fixed points due East of the Maas. The only sabotage troops to remain West of the Maas were small groups to carry out routine sabotage against traffic. The Allied plan was to drop great numbers of Parachute troops at the points on the Maas line where the insurgents had been assembled. In this plan a new bridge near Revin was particularly important and the Allies were said to be planning a thrust through the Maas line in the Charleville area.

Kdo. 307 had instructed the agent C.O. urgently to find out the following:

- number of armed insurgents on which the A.B.S. Movement was counting;
- main assembly centres;
- times at which the dropping of airborne troops was to be expected.

An obscure feature of this last report is that though it was despatched to Oberstleutnant GISKES, head of Kdo. 307 from Cologne, it was sent to the head of Kdo. 306 to pass to Oberstleutnant REILE.

Dear Hedger,

I am sending herewith the property belonging to a certain LINDENMANS who has just been sent to this country for interrogation. LINDENMANS is a man who prior to the Spring of this year was connected with an escape organisation concerned in passing Dutchmen through France to the Peninsula. Whether at that time he was working for the Germans is by no means clear. Subsequently LINDENMANS certainly did become a German agent and during the Spring and Summer of this year has betrayed a number of loyal Dutchmen to the Germans. Furthermore LINDENMANS was recently appointed Liaison Officer between the Dutch Forces of the Interior and the Canadian Army attached to the Canadian Army Staff. He admits passing across the lines, ostensibly on behalf of the Allies but in reality in order to pass information regarding Allied operational intentions to the enemy. It is most unlikely that he would have secret writing materials concealed in any place in which they were not easily accessible to himself and I think that the destruction of his shoes, of which there is beginning to be rather a shortage at Camp O2Q, could be dispensed with.

Miss Hannah yesterday morning brought to me two cards relating to C.C. including the important message of 22nd August. I at once got into touch with Mr. Roberts who had not yet seen the material. In the course of the conversation he told me that he was also sending over M.S.S. information about BARKER.

I then rang Camp 020 and after some delay spoke to Major Wall-Row to whom I gave the information of August (I did not appreciate the relevance of the July message and did not refer to this). Later Colonel Stephens (who had been away) rang and expressed grave perturbation about VERLOOP whom he identified as NELLIS. I repeated to him the M.S.S. information and he said that he proposed to tackle LINDEMANS on this at once. He also asked for further information of other conferences etc. at which LINDEMANS had attended where he might have obtained important information.

I spoke again to Roberts who told me that VERLOOP would be brought over on or about 7th November. He had already warned the Field but had not appreciated that the interrogators also wanted the information about LINDEMANS movement. He is sending a "Most Immediate" cable.

As the 020 exchange was closed I could not inform Colonel Stephens of the conversation.

Dear MacBermott,

I enclose herewith a further report which has been received from Camp O2O regarding LINDEMANS (which appears to be the correct spelling of ~~HIV'ENSE~~).

So far the last contact which LINDEMANS admits with the enemy was at the beginning of October and it must be assumed that everything of value known to him up to that date was passed to the enemy. Since the report was received I have had some conversations with Camp O2O interrogators who say that LINDEMANS has now admitted that VERLOOP's account of his actions is correct. He admits the denunciations but is at present taking a line that he had not pass information of an operational character. This we of course know to be untrue.

I am attaching to the report two lists of names and addresses taken from LINDEMANS' property some of which may have significance when examined locally.

The interrogation is proceeding with very great difficulty since LINDEMANS has to be attended by a doctor and only a little can be got from him at a time.

Since dictating the attached note dated 5.11.44 regarding LINDBERG's connection with the escape route penetrated at the instance and apparently at the direction of Obersturmbaumeister STURBE of ~~WAMM~~ ^{WAMM} I have had the advantage of seeing the material from Most Secret Sources dated 22.8.44 which has been passed to you and some other material dated 11.7.44 of a similar character which has not so far been passed to you since it was thought probably not to refer to LINDBERG.

This latter information from Most Secret Sources shows that on the date specified Paris was making enquiries from Toulouse in connection with V-Mann C.O. asking for a report about payment since V-Mann C.O. had no effects of any kind. The significance of this information is far from clear as well as its meaning but the connection with Toulouse is not without interest suggesting, contrary to LINDBERG's contention in the report sent to us under cover of your IP of 6.11.44 that LINDBERG was recruited sooner than the end of May or beginning of June 1944. In this connection it will be observed that in the material of 22.8.44 V-Mann C.O. was then referred to as a Proven V-Mann of Kommando 307.

In connection with [LINDBERG] who was the man who LINDBERG says passed him across the lines and who appears to be identical with the character who performed a similar service for DAREN, I should be grateful for your assistance in the following connection. BERRY states that the man to whom he handed the American, BERRY, was Gustav HOLLEVOISE or Georges HOLLEVOISE whereas BERRY states that the man's name was ANKAT.

I have been examining the full reports of the characters who have passed through the I.R.C. and who have mentioned LINDEMANN, short extracts of which were contained in the file which we sent you.

The man LOWRY BALL figures prominently in the above reports. The greater part of our information regarding BALL comes from Phillipus Christianus TUTS. TUTS had a friend in the shape of LOWRY BALL, a student of engineering who tried to reach Spain at the beginning of March 1943, was caught by the Germans, sent to a concentration camp and then taken to Toulouse and agreed to enter into the service of the S.D. as an informer at an airport. He was sent to La Bourget Airport to obtain permission to return to Holland in August 1943 to work at an aircraft factory. He then, after a few weeks, left without permission and returned home to Wijnhaven 8, Delft. Thereafter, according to TUTS, he made a living by going to France on S.D. documents, purchasing cigarette papers there and selling them at a profit in Holland. On one occasion in October 1943 he took with him one, E.Jarbus KOEGER, to Paris on forged S.D. documents, and on his return he told TUTS that the organization with which he had put KOEGER in touch had passed him across the frontier in Spain. It subsequently transpired, however, that KOEGER was arrested in France and divulged his escape contacts to the Germans. When TUTS became convinced that BALL was able to obtain false S.D. documents and had contacts in Paris, TUTS decided to try and leave Holland this way. BALL introduced him to SCHARRER c Henri DUPON, a journalist who appeared to TUTS to make a living out of forging S.D. documents. SCHARRER supplied TUTS with

1. Sonderausweis D. for travelling purpose
2. A document for crossing the frontier.
3. A proof that TUTS was employed by the S.D. from November 1943 until his departure

From November 1943 until his departure TUTS resided with BALL and his wife and then set out with BALL by train for Maastricht where they spent a night and then by train to Paris. In Paris TUTS collected money from the Hotel St. Marie and he and his friends were put up at the Hotel des Deux Hemispheres, rue des Mathiers. There TUTS found DE GRAAF, CELOSSE, BOLLMEIN and BANS, all of whom were unknown to him and most of whom had obtained S.D. documents from SCHARRER in Rotterdam.

After arriving in Paris ~~LOWRY BALL~~ took TUTS to meet a man he described as one of the heads of the organization who was to arrange for their escape, namely SEARINE, at the Hotel des Medicis, rue M. Le Prince, Paris (It is to be observed that according to TUTS, SEARINE was in the habit of visiting LOWRY BALL in Delft and knew of BALLS complicity with the Germans). SEARINE stated there were difficulties with the route owing to the arrest of several members. In this connection it is to be observed that the arrival of TUTS in Paris came very shortly after the chain of arrests which followed the penetration of the route with which LAURKELJONSON was connected. TUTS does not himself mention LINDEMANN but we know from stories told by DE GRAAF and CELOSSE that he was in Paris working with SEARINE at the time.

The interrogation report on DE GRAAF confirms that CELOSSE *(was the contact)* contact CHARRER (no doubt identical with SCHARRER referred to by TUTS) and obtain documents allegedly issued by the S.D.
