

REMARKS

I have now received the results of the look-up on the field report and can therefore comment on it in greater detail than heretofore. The earlier part of the report deals largely with the penetration of A.G. and as the interrogator will be in direct contact with A.G. and I have not yet had their detailed comments I will not attempt to deal in detail with the first 15 paragraphs. It is, however, perhaps worth pointing out that LAUWERK referred to in paragraph 6 and elsewhere has recently been brought to this country by A.G. and is under suspicion of being the prime cause of the A.G. breakdown in Holland. His statement when compared with HUNTERSON's information about him will assist in judging the case of LAUWERK.

It is satisfactory to see from the last sentence of paragraph 10 that HUNTERSON confirms the view which was formed in this country after a prolonged investigation of KREMER.

1. I do not at the moment know whether some of the agents, for example, HUNTERSON, referred to in para.15 were agents of A.G. or A.I.A. This will no doubt emerge from the discussions with A.G. I am particularly interested in the steps taken by the Germans to provide traffic to run off sets of controlled agents. In the case of A.G. agents where the traffic was ~~not~~ concerned with recruitment and supplies this may not have been so difficult a task, but the background from the German side for the provision of false traffic ~~for~~ for agents whose missions consisted of espionage rather than ~~allied~~ resistance is a matter of interest. In particular the deliberate deception plans and the organisation behind the supply of such information, if it in fact took place, is a matter about which we would like to know more.

The story of KREMER in para.16 is, of course, well known to you. The general information in paras. 17 and 18 is confirmed from other sources but I have not yet heard from the interested services about DAUBER (para.19).

You have already cleared the point that LUDWIG is identical with a captured allied agent previously referred to as V.WYNNING.

The case of LINDBERG (para.21) is well known to you.

A.G. will no doubt be able to ascertain from LINDBERG whether para.22 is correct.

We have a good deal of information about the agents school at Ichtl. I send herewith three copies of a note on missions given to certain captured agents who were trained at that school and a list of agents and officials referred to by these captured agents. (which please return in due course). As far as the general information about the school is concerned agents state that they were in training about 15 Flemish and 20 French agents, all former informants of the Gestapo or members of the R.P.P. or Gestapo (it is not quite clear if they are referring only to agents of R.P.P. or whether these figures are supposed to include members of other P.T.s who shared the school). One of the agents said that the pupils did not have a

good impression of the instructors who smoked the agents' cigarettes and drank their liquor. They seemed to have very little interest in the school, although this was not known to the head of the X.M. There is some difficulty in identifying the various agents and instructors owing to the extensive use of cover names, but a table has been prepared and is sent herewith, summarising details of personnel which has been obtained from the various sources. With HUNTERMAN's aid it should be possible to tie up some of the identifications more closely and HUNTERMAN or CLAINE may be able to provide real names in at least some instances. If possible it is preferable that HUNTERMAN and CLAINE should not know exactly which agents have been captured. A point which particularly requires elucidation is the reference to a group of Spanish agents said to be working for the Germans in Belgium known as the HOLY CROSS.

Another point on which I should like to know more is whether agents from this school were parachuted behind the allied lines or whether they were only used as lime-crossers or stay-behinds. It would be useful if HUNTERMAN could give details of the training referred to in para.25 of the field report, particularly on the penetration technique adopted. The SOE mission referred to in para.29 of the field report has come to grief. CLAINE's real name is Henri TOUTAIN, and he was arrested on April 20th at Duppertal together with a companion Georges STUBIG, who is presumably HUNTERMAN's CLAINE. Roger DOUET & JACQUES, the third member of the group has so far escaped arrest. We have up till now only received a cable about this matter from which the following is an extract:-

"Letter Box Paris 0981. Call time 1500. If woman answers say GRENAD Postant. If man hang up immediately.

Other letter boxes 1080 (LUX) FARMER VADEN HEDOW,  
Fuerstenau Lichtenstein or Sophie WILHELM, Neulen 12, Berstettum,  
Lichtenstein."

HUNTERMAN or CLAINE may be able to clarify references to Paris letter boxes and may also give particulars of other letter boxes in Lichtenstein, or elsewhere. One of CLAINE's contacts is said to be MACHLAND who we have not so far identified. Perhaps HUNTERMAN can assist. It is not clear to me to whom these agents were supposed to report if they were given their instructions at the last minute. What exactly were their penetration instructions and did these have a long term character?

What was the purpose of obtaining American identity papers as referred to in para.30 of the field report? Oberstlt. MICHAEL referred to in para.30, is presumably identical with a man of that name known to us as having been at Prende Heer West in 1944. HUNTERMAN should give further details.

The list set out in Annex I can largely be checked and is extremely accurate. I cannot, however, trace the Schutze HUNTERMAN referred to under PAK 306, unless he is our old friend CLAINE & ARNAUD etc.

Para.2 of Annex I is in accord with information known. It was known that the various Room III units used as cover names the names of drinks but details were not hitherto known and if the list given in the field report can be amplified this would be an advantage. Para.4 of Annex I about the GRUCCO net and the amplification of cover names as above should be put to GRUCCO. WALTERS is almost certainly identical with a man of that name who was arrested at Krefeld in March. He was evasive under interrogation and only admitted contact with one Capt. HOFF, whom we thought might have been HOFF of F.M. 364. WALTERS claimed that HOFF had asked him to obtain information of the state of Krefeld after allied occupation. WALTERS will, no doubt, in due course be re-interrogated and it would be useful to his interrogators if GRUCCO and HOFFMANN give full information about him.

I am interested in the purpose behind attempts by Buehr personnel to camouflage their identity as set out in para.6 of Annex I. Is this done merely in the hopes of evading arrest or is it done with the intention of the individuals concerned working underground during the allied occupation? Para.7 is in exact accord with what has been stated by //s HOFFMANN who is referred to by HOFFMANN.

Paras.8 and 9 are in accord with existing knowledge. Is it known whether the U.S. run agents for deception purposes or merely for C.I. purposes? GRUCCO should be in a position greatly to amplify para.10 dealing with the relationship between MI. net and Leitstelle III West. Reference in para.10 to ant VIII is presumably an error for ant VI. 1. FAUCONNIER.

+ FAUCONNIER is identical with LACQUEMANT. HUNTEMANN first came into contact with him in August 1944. FAUCONNIER was handled by Uffz. NIKHOF. HUNTEMANN states that FAUCONNIER is a man of weak character who readily agreed to work for the Germans. On three occasions FAUCONNIER had R/T contact, under control, with Allied 'planes, the call sign being "Marius II". This operation was given the code name "FAULKE RAFFELLE" by the Germans.

FAUCONNIER was released by HUNTEMANN in Lille on 1st September 1944. The Funkabwehr, Lille, was responsible for FAUCONNIER's arr.

2. The undermentioned members of Amt Niederlands are stated by HUNTEMANN to be of exceptional interest and would well repay close interrogation when arrested:

Uffz. Willy KUPP VAN DER CAMP & WILLY & SALM & KUPFER.

*Wendell*

Nationality German; aged 45; corpulent; height 1.80m; medium coloured hair, slightly grey; blue-grey eyes; sometimes wears glasses as disguise; round face; cleanshaven; generally wore plain clothes; hangs his head when walking; speaks Dutch with German accent and German with Lower Rhine accent.

Worked for Abwehr (Abt. I) in Holland before the war. Posted to Amt Niederlands (LIIIF) probably early in 1941. In March 1944 posted to FAK 307, Brussels. Whilst in Holland handled most of the important LIIIF agents such as KLEINENHOF and LINDEMANS. Is a close personal friend of GIMES and is engaged to Magda JANSSEN (see below). Home address Elten am Niederrhein, Adolf-Hitler Platz 2. His father is owner of the Gasthaus "Zum Stern" in this place, but is believed to have been evacuated to Herscheid, Gasthof "Zum Neuenhaus". HUNTEMANN states that this man is very alert and suspicious. KUPP, although not a Nazi, would, according to HUNTEMANN, be attracted to any post-war movement organised by the Abwehr.

Magda JANSSEN.

Nationality German; aged 24; slender figure; height 1.72m; dark brown hair; slightly slit eyes; languages Dutch and German with Lower Rhine accent.

Had already been in Amt Niederlands a long time before HUNTEMANN arrived in December 1941. Was employed as cashier and "Fuehrer des geheimen Haushalt". Posted to FAK 307, Brussels, in March 1944 and moved in September 1944 to Düsseldorf bei Bonn. Was with FAK 307 at its dissolution at Husingenhausen. Her father worked for Amt Wilhelmshaven and Amt Niederlands as V-Mann. She is engaged to KUPP (above).

Major Wells of S.O.E. informed me that he was particularly interested in pers. 6, page 2 of the HUNTEMANN Field report, dealing with LAUWERS who had recently been brought back to this country by S.O.E. He had been landed as an accredited agent and was at present writing out a statement of his activities. It was apparent that he was one of the major causes of the breakdown of S.O.E. in Holland. Major Wells was anxious to know how his case could best be handled.

I pointed out that we were not anxious to send further people to Camp O20 who were of comparatively local interest, and that we hoped to obtain all the information we wanted about the III P activities in Holland from HUNTEMANN and GISKES.

It was arranged that in the first instance Major Wells should let us have details of LAUWERS' story as told by himself, which could then be checked up with HUNTEMANN.

I subsequently discussed the position with M.I.5 Mr. Bird, who agreed that the question of LAUWERS' guilt or otherwise was not a matter of great interest to M.I.5, but that if consideration of his case showed that he should be treated as a guilty man then the best course would probably be to hand him over to the Dutch Security authorities.

I send you herewith three copies of the Field interrogation on this man, who is due to arrive this evening. There has not yet been time to check this report in detail but one can see at a glance that this report is substantially accurate and it seems unlikely that HUNTEMANN is making any attempt to mislead. In particular, HUNTEMANN's references to "NORDPOL", the reorganisation of the Abwehr, the case of LINDEMANN, the Wiehl agents' school, the details of some of the agents from the school, the personalities of the III PAKs and PATs, and most of the general information conforms to what is already known. HUNTEMANN himself was, of course, previously known from several cases and in particular his undoubted skill in assisting in the running of captured Allied agents and their wireless sets.

I also send you three copies of a paper on the III PAKs and PATs which summarises such knowledge as we had of these units up to a week or two ago. The information already given by HUNTEMANN in the Field considerably supplements this previous knowledge and HUNTEMANN can no doubt fill up other gaps in our knowledge of the III personnel of the G.I.S., although it may be that on units other than his own GISKES, who is due to go to Camp 020, may be better informed.

We are of course particularly interested in any evidence of any intended long-term activities, and it is possible, though perhaps unlikely, that HUNTEMANN may know of any such intentions.

A further point on which HUNTEMANN's evidence would be of value is the extent of the penetration of Resistance movements and the like.

There is sent herewith for perusal and return, a note on activities against S.O.E. in Holland with which HUNTEMANN was most particularly concerned. S.O.E. have naturally the greatest possible interest in HUNTEMANN and his senior officer, GISKES, since between them they practically ran S.O.E. in Holland for the best part of 14 months.

At any rate to begin with the most important point to cover is how the G.I.S. originally got hold of S.O.E. in Holland and how from the first starting-point they gradually absorbed the organisation in the Field. The initial act of penetration and the subsequent exploitation of it is what S.O.E. most want to know, although they may wish to go into many points of detail at a later stage. S.O.E. have offered all facilities and will willingly assist in briefing the interrogator if you should desire this. In particular they could of course produce the relevant wireless traffic. They recently got back to this country some of their Dutch agents who have at one time or another done work under enemy control and between them the various agents now in their hands cover pretty well the whole history of the penetration.

I have asked S.O.E. to comment in detail on the Field report on HUNTEMANN. While the details of the collapse are perhaps of interest to S.O.E. rather than of general interest, it is I think important to do our best to ascertain which members of the Resistance were in reality working for the Germans. Such people if accepted as genuine patriots could become dangerous in the future.

There is one small point that might be worth clearing up at an early stage. A P/W who was a code expert and was from time to time called in to assist in connection with the coding of wireless traffic run by HUNTEMANN, mentioned an agent from Lille who was being run, to whom the P/W gave the name FAUCONNIER. The particulars of the agent resemble very closely those given in pars. 20 of the Field report with reference to LACQUEMANT. It might be as well to ask HUNTEMANN whether he knows the name FAUCONNIER.

Many thanks for your most interesting letter under reference PF.601,712/WRC.4a with PF.601,832/WRC.4a reference to GIESSES and HUNTERMANN.

We have of course a great deal of information on the activities of these two characters, and so far as I know, no better guide exists to HUNTERMANN than the reports of the interrogations of HUNTERMANN.

Both these characters are of the greatest possible interest to us, since they, between them, practically ran our Organisation in Holland in toto for the best part of 14 months. One is of course tempted to feel one would like to go through with them every telegram in our traffic files for the period, but this is clearly impossible; I think that at any rate to begin with, the most important point to cover is how they originally got control of our Organisation, and how from this first starting point, they gradually absorbed our Organisation in the Field. The initial act of penetration and the subsequent exploitation of it by the enemy is, after all, what we really want to know.

I do not know how you anticipate handling these two cases, but I have in this Section at the moment, myself and one other person who have specialized in the Dutch troubles and should you like to have
