





MEMORARDUM.

Christian LINDENANS, mlias KING KONG, was first brought to my notice on Sept. 18th by the Capts. de JONG and de GRAAF, both attached to the H.Q. of H.R.H.

As a result of what they told me of this male my worlded to investigate, and I contacted a young Dutch girl, Elly ZMAMN, daughter of a dealer in ceresla in Hattel, near Maline. This girl, though seduced by DUMEMANS and robbed by him of all she possessed under the protence that he needed her money in order to keep his "Secret Organisation" going, was at the moment still in love with the man. Never-the-less, the following was established. K.K. had for a considerable time been doing good Underground work for the Allies, until he was shot through the lung in a short fight with the S.S. and captured. He was transported to a hospital, from which he was freed after three weeks by his courades. Most of these comrades were captured during the attempt, but K.K. succeeded in escaping and returned to his Underground activities.

The wound in his chest was an actual fact, as it was tended

He has, however, given two different stories of his escape, telling one person that he escaped from Rotterdam, and another that he escaped from The Hague.

From the moment of his escape, everything he touched went varong, many of his conrades and of those he tried to help away were arrested, but he himself always managed to escape.

In connection with the above, the following very important factor has to be considered:

K.K. is a woman hunter without morals or conscience, but is really in love with one woman, a certain Mlle. G.W.OU, a French cabaret singer, with whom he has a child. At the time of his "escape", this woman was in the hands of the Germans.

certain MIA" A woman of unknown nationality, living in the Hotel Cosmopolite in Brussels and a self confessed worker for the S.D., who fled from Brussels shortly before the liberation of that town. He visited her regularly and spent several nights with her at the hotel.

He was in Brussels also in constant touch with a Swedish woman, who protended that she was a double agent, working for the S.D. as well as for the Allies. This woman was still living in Brussels, and had staying with her a young German boy; neither of them had, on Sept. 20th been out of doors yet since the liberation. This information I gave to a representative of S.H.A.E.F. and they were arrested. I do not know what happened with them subsequently.

At this stage of my investigations I decided to tackle K.K. himself seriously, I met him in Antwerp on Saturday, and told him to come and see me in Brussels the next Monday at 11 a.m., which he agreed to do.

He did not appear, however, and that same day I had todrop the whole matter.



Cotober 1943. BOTTENHERM had at last begun to feel that it was his duty to come to England. Almost immediately afterwards he met Capt GRETER in the Bar of the Park Hotel, Amsterdam. GRETER was grumbling about his failure to find a 'tuyan' for escape, and BOTTENHERM asked if he might not join in with the project. When GRETER agreed, BOTTENHERM suggested that they should cross into Belgium by his own line at Baarle, Nassau and try to get to the Spanish frontier without the help of an organisation. GRETER was unwilling to do this, but promised to let him know as soon as he heard of anything.

ESCAPE CONTACTS.

1. Chris LINDEMAN.

About 10th October GRETER gave BOTTENHEIM a rendez-vous at the Park Hotel, and there told him that he had what looked like a promising address. Apparently an acquaintance of GRETER's a laboratory assistant in the Geological Department of Leyden University had given him the address of a dentist in Rotterdam. On the next day they travelled together to Rotterdam and went to the house of the dentist: Van NACEL, 178, Noordsingel. They were admitted by a young woman and GRETER asked to see Mr. LINDEMANN. Shortly afterwards a boy of about 20 (Dutch, fair, tall and thin, long-faced) came in, and said that he was the brother of Chris LINDEMAN and what didthey want. After a certain amount of fencing they declared their intention to the boy who told them to return on the following day.

This time they met Chris LINDEMAN.

Dutch, aged 32, fair, blue-eyed, round-faced, limps in the right leg and has a crippled left arm.

After they had inspired confidence in him, Chris said that he could probably help them as he had helped a number of Canadian airmen. He required 100 Gulden from each of them and for that sum would supply them with Organisation TODT papers, which would see them as far as Cherbourg. There they would be conducted to the Spanish frontier by guides. It was arranged that they should meet in Rotterdam on the following Friday (possibly 22nd October).




After they left Rotterdam, GRETER, who did not seem satisfied with LINDEMAN, said that he had heard of another escape line, and it might be worth examining it before they decided to accept LINDEMAN's proposals. BOTTENHEIM is not able to may how GRETER had heard of this second contact, but they went to Amstelveen, a small village outside Amsterdam and there visited M. Henri SCHARRER.

this time in Amsterdam, and after they had left BOTTENHEIM told CRETER he felt the LINDEMAN suggestion was far better since it was less dangerous to be caught with false organisation TODT papers than with false Sicherheitsdients ones GRETER was all for taking both sets of papers, but BOTTENHEIM was more cautious. The conversation grew heated and GRETER announced that he had a third possibility which he would take if the opportunity offered: there would not be room for BOTTENHEIM in this third line. Before they parted they arranged tentatively to go to Rotterdam on 2nd or 3rd November.

On the 1st or 2nd November, GRETER telephoned BOTTENHEIM to say that his third escape possibility (i.e. neither SCHARRER nor LINDEMAN) had materialised and that he would avail himself of it. . . . From an abundance of caution, GRETER asked BOTTENHEIM to procure him organisation TODT papers from LINDEMAN in case he should require them for the journey from Paris, South. Accordingly, on the next day BOTTENHEIM went to Rotterdam where he saw Van MAGEL's reception at. She said that the LINDEMANS had left two days before and their present address was not known.



KREMER and Van HEUKENSFRIDT-JANSEN were given blank O.T. papers which thet had to fill in themselves copying one which LIND MANNS had already filled in. The necessary stamps were already LINDEMANNS stated/ on the paper.

C.S.6. had a means of exfiltration through the Witte Brigade in RELGIUM. Source did not know how the contact between C.S.6. and the Witte Brigade was worked, but he knew a man called AART ENTVALD who was one of the links between them. This man travelled regularly between AMSTERDAM and PARIS for the Germans and had a German permit; these papers he had copied.

C.S.6. would have tried to send source by this route if he had not been able to go another way, but as it was, they did not get to the stage of planning his journey by this means.

- b) Source also knew another man in AMSTENDAM who had special Sicherheitsdienst cards which were valid for unrestricted travel and which he could copy and would give to people wishing to leave the country.
- c) The underground paper TROUW has a route from Holland to PARIS. Source says that this was a way from ROTTERDAM to PARIS by O.T. papers, but that the route was becoming more difficult owing to the Germans tightening up their control of O.T. workers owing to a number of desertions, etc. Only R.A.F. pilots knew that a man belonging to HET PAROOL had come that way, also a Captain SUTHERLAND who said that he was an Englishman; DE GRAAF came out this way.

This route was a direct rail one to PARIS, where the contact was CHRISTEN LINDEMAIN, who, being a very big man, worked under the nickname of KING KONG. LINDEMANN had a route from PARIS to the PYRANEES in conjunction with a French organisation with which the contact was a MADAME........... of 26 rms Clichy, PARIS. On November 16th BOTTENHEIM visited an address which Chris LINDEMAN had given him, M. Van HERMSTRA, 3 rue Lord Byron. This gentleman was very friendly but said he was just off to Holland JEAN BENEDECTINE @ FORD. Source went to LINDEMANN on arrival in PARIS in December 1943, and LINDEMANN was then living on the Boulevard Victor Hugo At that time however there were several arrests in the French organisation and LINDEMANN was going to change his address. Source presumes that he has done this and does not know where he is now living. Source said that he had not much contact with travel routes in HOLLAND, except during his last few weeks, when he wished to get out himself. He had heard of people going through BELGIUM, and travelling through BRUSSELS with O.T. papers, but he did not know who dealt with them in BRUSSELS, tio or any further details. Source had never heard of an ex-policeman of the name VAN BILSEN, neither did he know many people in HELGIUM. VAN VLIET and J.J. GEORGE. Source said that they learnt the descriptions of probable Gestapo agents by heart. Asked if he knew anything about GEORGE's work, source replied that he only knew of his work with DE GRAAF and G.S.6. When source was in PARIS he heard from CHRISTEN LINDEMANN that GEORGE had been there shortly before and had tried to get to the PYRAMERS. He was in PARIS at the same time as source, so source and LINDEMANN went to RIST his address to liquidate him, but he was not there; they then went back to the bar which he frequented, which was opposite the back of the Gestapo Headquarters building, just off the Rue ot one. Paubourg, but could not find him there either. LINDEMANN had told source that he had met a good fellow called GEORGE who wasa member of the British Secret Service and could deliver money and arms.
