Identification of Allied Agents.

Password "TOULOUSE".

1. In view of the number of agents of ours and of other orgs who are over-run by fwd tps, it has been found that only the simplest of recognition devices are practicable.
2. Until further instrs are received, the password "TOULOUSE", which is now well known as belonging to SF, will be given to future agents.
3. Obviously, a common password can only be regarded by fwd tps and PS sections as a guide to disposal and NOT a security check. Full recognition phrases, etc. will be given to assist in security vetting.
4. Under no circumstances should numbers be given as this leads to confusion with M.I.6 whose agents have registered numbers. This fact is well known by PS sections, and any over-run persons quoting a number, would invariably be handed over to 2 I.U.

Reference 33700/A's telegram addressed Brussels. 67 repeated London 131 of 27th October and my TP on 03/72 of 29th October.

1. Christiaan Antholius LINDEMANS @ Christiaan Antonius LANDEMANS born 24th October 1912 at Rotterdam.
2. Known as KING KONG in Dutch and British circles.
3. Aliases Christiaan BRAND and apparently also De VRIES.
4. Profession appears to be automobile instructor.
5. Following addresses taken from his papers appear to have been used by him:
 - a. Slaakstraat 10, Amsterdam, in May 1941.
 - b. Chaussees de Waterloo 327, Brussels, date unknown but appears recent.
 - c. Lindenhof - Battle, Mechelin, in October 1944.
6. Also had in name BRAND to (?) certificates signed by Captain P.B. BAKER, O.C. number 3 Field Headquartersafks sugar 9 certifying that he is employed by I.S. 9 and has permission to travel.
7. Also in his possession was Top Secret document dated 6th October 1944 signed by Captain GAUMOND of Number 2 Special Force Detachment and addressed to him under LIA// alias KING KONG. This stated that password TOULOUSE will be used by S.F. agents. Document mentions that M.I.6 agents have registered numbers and if picked up by F.S.S. should be handed over to 2 I.U.
8. I have informed 2 I.U.
9. KB potentialities of this case appear likely to be of considerable importance. KINGKONG is a X stated to have betrayed more than 100 Dutch patriots during his many trips across the lines. This appears borne out by fact that nearly every Resistance or Escape organisation with which he has been connected has been betrayed.
10. In view of his close association with BERNARD's & BERNARD's Headquarters and the fact that this Dutch staff is notoriously indiscreet, it is feared that & K may & have given Germans valuable military intelligence.
11. We ourselves have nobody capable of Unter/// undertaking detailed interrogation of this man in Dutch. Apart from this he is reported to be a tough character and interrogation is likely to be long and difficult. Extreme personal enmity between K.K. and PINTO makes it undesirable for latter to interrogate.
12. Most important that K.K. should be interrogated as soon as possible on what military information he has passed to Germans.

Clearly he will have to be broken before this can be obtained.

13. Therefore recommend that he be sent to UK for expert interrogation. His papers indicate his status is civilian.
14. Propose despatching by first available aircraft on or after tomorrow Wednesday November 1st.
15. Please approve urgently.

Statement on: KING KONG by VERLOOP.

Early in March 1944 I became acquainted with Christiaan LINDEMANS of Rotterdam, in the Grand Hotel Boulevard, Brussels through a N.S.B. ~~One Willy Van DEPUTEE~~ ~~of Leiden who greatly desired to have dealings with the D.A. (Deutsche Atwone), DECHIS,~~ or as he was known to the D.A. "C.C." had a brother imprisoned in the Schevenings Geol for helping British persons to escape.

C.C. wished to meet the head of the D.A. and was prepared to tell all he knew in order to have his brother released. I travelled to Holland and 24 hours later the head of the D.A. (3F) arrived in Brussels where in a villa in the outskirts, the talk continued throughout the night. C.C. said that he knew the whole English set up in Holland, Belgium, France and Spain. He displayed a D. Soldbuch, badge? and all possible stamps of the Wehrmacht and travel tickets.

After he obtained the promise of Lieut. Col. Gieskens alias Dr. CERNARD that his brother would be released, he telephoned various British agents, men and women, for discussions re activities to take place within the next few weeks, these taking place mainly in Churches and Cafes. All this arranged under the personal leadership of Dr. GIESKENS, and the collaborator ~~Willy KUP alias ZALM and ARNAUDS~~ a one time German Foreign Legionary.

C.C. intimated that he was in the British service in Rotterdam since 1938. In all his work on the behalf of the D.A. he had the good fortune by reason of his connection with British agents and Resistance groups in the Interior to be able to give (Contact) and reports to the collaborators of the D.A. Thus many persons in Paris, Bordeaux and Boudayo were arrested. In Amsterdam the whole group C.S. VI, in Leiden, Rotterdam and also the Hague. It was never the policy to arrest everyone connected with the various groups, some spies were left alone to "play on" further.

In either the Hague or Rotterdam he was shot through the chest in a raid by a member of the S.D. because the S.D. or the Gestapo did not know or were not meant to know that C.C. belonged to the D.A. and if he got into trouble he had to have the Befehlshaber of the Netherlands telephoned and call for Dr. VOGELER. He was taken to a hospital with the assistance of GIESKENS where an attempt at rescue was to take place. By this means forty seven persons were arrested.

Unimportant information on a solitary English Airman was allowed to go through so as not to arouse suspicion. The important material was always snapped up especially miniature films and/or photographs from Germany or Holland.

In Belgium he handed over a complete group of British agents. Here he had an affair with ~~Elly ZWAAN~~ daughter of one of the leaders of the White brigade and by reason of this travelled between Mechlin, Antwerp, Brussels, Luik and the Ardens. He travelled a lot, personally to distribute arms and other material, always followed by German Police personnel, and they carried out arrests without suspicion falling on him.

In all two hundred and sixty seven (267) persons were arrested.

About four weeks ago C.C. dressed in rags came to Briebergen at night and there made a full report to the D.A. leader there, Major KIESWETTER alias BADER giving the names of the members of the Netherlands Secret service, among them Major PLOON, Capt. BACER, Sgt. MONTFORD, more I cannot remember.

C.C. would never have done this but his nerves were frayed through anxiety for his brother.

MEMORANDUM.

Christiaan LINDEMANS, alias KING KONG, was first brought to my notice on Sept. 18th by the Capts. de JONG and de GRAAF, both attached to the H.Q. of H.R.H.

As a result of what they told me of this man, I decided to investigate, and I contacted a young Dutch girl, Elly ZWAAN, daughter of a dealer in cereals in Battel, near Malins. This girl, though seduced by LINDEMANS and robbed by him of all she possessed under the pretence that he needed her money in order to keep his "Secret Organisation" going, was at the moment still in love with the man. Never-the-less, the following was established. K.K. had for a considerable time been doing good Underground work for the Allies, until he was shot through the lung in a short fight with the S.S. and captured. He was transported to a hospital, from which he was freed after three weeks by his comrades. Most of these comrades were captured during the attempt, but K.K. succeeded in escaping and returned to his Underground activities.

RECORDED
26 MAY 1945
The wound in his chest was an actual fact, as it was tended by Elly ZWAAN.

He has, however, given two different stories of his escape, telling one person that he escaped from Rotterdam, and another that he escaped from The Hague.

From the moment of his escape, everything he touched went wrong, many of his comrades and of those he tried to help away were arrested, but he himself always managed to escape.

In connection with the above, the following very important factor has to be considered:

K.K. is a woman hunter without morals or conscience, but is really in love with one woman, a certain Mlle. GILOU, a French cabaret singer, with whom he has a child. At the time of his "escape", this woman was in the hands of the Germans.

It was further established that he had had an "affair" with a certain "MIA", a woman of unknown nationality, living in the Hotel Cosmopolite in Brussels and a self confessed worker for the S.D., who fled from Brussels shortly before the liberation of that town. He visited her regularly and spent several nights with her at the hotel.

He was in Brussels also in constant touch with a Swedish woman, who pretended that she was a double agent, working for the S.D. as well as for the Allies. This woman was still living in Brussels, and had staying with her a young German boy; neither of them had, on Sept. 20th been out of doors yet since the liberation. This information I gave to a representative of S.H.A.E.F. and they were arrested. I do not know what happened with them subsequently.

At this stage of my investigations I decided to tackle K.K. himself seriously, I met him in Antwerp on Saturday, and told him to come and see me in Brussels the next Monday at 11 a.m., which he agreed to do.

He did not appear, however, and that same day I had to drop the whole matter.

You will remember that DASH denounced a man called VERLOOP; VERLOOP was detained and denounced Chris LINDSMANN @ KING KONG who, he said, had been working for a long time for the Abwehr. Chris LINDSMANN was in fact appointed by Prince Bernhard as Liaison Officer with the Dutch Forces of the Interior, and until he was arrested was working with the Canadians. This information is contained in a telegram from the field which is partially corrupt, but it appears that working with LINDSMANN as liaison officer is a certain GORDON @ DE VRIES who has previously given some trouble. The telegram commenting on VERLOOP's information stated that he considered his information to be reliable.

Following VERLOOP's denunciation, Chris LINDSMANN was detained. I attach herewith a copy of a telegram from the field regarding his arrest. Arrangements were made to send him to this country and he should be arriving in the course of the afternoon or evening.

We have traces of Chris LINDSMANN which I am getting together as a matter of urgency, dating from 1943; such traces are on the whole favourable but show LINDSMANN to have been in contact with a GEORGE who claimed to be a member of the British Secret Service in December 1943 and who would accompany LINDSMANN to Spain. From other information reaching us at the beginning of 1944 it appeared that LINDSMANN was missing, and it was suggested that he had been shot.

The importance of the matter is apparent from the terms of the telegram from the field.

They carried on this work for about two months, but by the end of October 1943, they were becoming rather well-known and, as a result of this, KARSSSEN was arrested.

Meanwhile, KREMER was seeking a means of escape together with a student-friend, HEUKENSELDT-JANSSEN. As stated in the report on JANSSEN, they first all planned to leave with the assistance of LINDEMANN (known), but this fell through.

ESCAPE CONTACTS.

1. Chris LINDEMAN.

About 10th October GRETER gave BOTTENHEIM a rendez-vous at the Park Hotel, and there told him that he had what looked like a promising address. Apparently an acquaintance of GRETER's a laboratory assistant in the Geological Department of Leyden University had given him the address of a dentist in Rotterdam. On the next day they travelled together to Rotterdam and went to the house of the dentist: Van NAGEL, 178, Noordsingel. They were admitted by a young woman and GRETER asked to see Mr. LINDEMAN. Shortly afterwards a boy of about 20 (Dutch, fair, tall and thin, long-faced) came in, and said that he was the brother of Chris LINDEMAN and what did they want. After a certain amount of fencing they declared their intention to the boy who told them to return on the following day.

This time they met Chris LINDEMAN.

Dutch, aged 32, fair,
blue-eyed, round-faced,
limps in the right leg
and has a crippled left arm.

After they had inspired confidence in him, Chris said that he could probably help them as he had helped a number of Canadian airmen. He required 100 Guilden from each of them and for that sum would supply them with Organisation TODT papers, which would see them as far as Cherbourg. There they would be conducted to the Spanish frontier by guides. It was arranged that they should meet in Rotterdam on the following Friday (possibly 22nd October).

2. Henri SCHARRER.

After they left Rotterdam, GRETER, who did not seem satisfied with LINDEMAN, said that he had heard of another escape line, and it might be worth examining it before they decided to accept LINDEMAN's proposals. BOTTENHEIM is not able to say how GRETER had heard of this second contact, but they went to Amstelveen, a small village outside Amsterdam and there visited M. Henri SCHARRER.

..... A further meeting was arranged, this time in Amsterdam, and after they had left BOTTENHEIM told GRETER he felt the LINDEMAN suggestion was far better since it was less dangerous to be caught with false organisation TODT papers than with false Sicherheitsdienst ones. GRETER was all for taking both sets of papers, but BOTTENHEIM was more cautious. The conversation grew heated and GRETER announced that he had a third possibility which he would take if the opportunity offered: there would not be room for BOTTENHEIM in this third line. Before they parted they arranged tentatively to go to Rotterdam on 2nd or 3rd November.

On the 1st or 2nd November, GRETER telephoned BOTTENHEIM to say that his third escape possibility (i.e. neither SCHARRER nor LINDEMAN) had materialised and that he would avail himself of it. Pastiaan Wijnand GANDERHEYDEN, a Dutch Telephone exchange clerk of Rotterdam, was helped in his escape from Holland in July 1943, by an escape organisation known as KING KONG, run by Chris LINDEMANS. GANDERHEYDEN eventually arrived in UK 16.3.44., via France and Gibraltar.

..... In June 1943 all employees employed at the Telephone Exchange between the ages of 19 and 35 were liable for service. This prompted GANDERHEYDEN to leave the country as he was determined not to go to Germany. He got into touch with some people who were able to help him on his way, through his sister Johanna, who was living with his aunt, Miss Margaretta GANDERHEYDEN residing at 180a Noordsingel, Rotterdam. Their neighbour living at No. 178 was a certain Dr. NAGEL who had with him a certain LINDEMANS. This man had a brother Chris LINDEMANS normally residing in Roosendaal who was either a member of or in touch with an Escape Organisation.

The latter is described as a man of 35/40; tall; 1m.85/90; dark hair; clean shaven; recently GANDERHEYDEN had news from his people in Holland in Spain informing him that Chris LINDEMANS was missing which probably means that he was shot; LINDEMANS at the time provided him with a forged urlabschein which was made out on heading paper of the German firm LATSCHA in Cherbourg, contractors to the Todt Organisation. This urlabschein had a limited validity and he obtained it against payment of 100 fls.

GANDERHEYDEN left Rotterdam on the 15th July with his brother Pieter and a certain Mr. BAARS, who pretended to be in the 'know' of certain underground work. They arrived in Paris the same day it had been arranged that Mr. Chris LINDEMANS would meet them at the station but nobody turned up so they all passed the first night in a small hotel in the vicinity of the Gare du Nord. The following morning BAARS recommended them a pension situated 38, Avenue des Termes, Paris, and the following day on the 17th BAARS disappeared and was never seen again.

The two brothers GANDERHEYDEN remained about a week in this pension in the hope of picking up LINDEMANS. During this time they also made the acquaintance of a Mr. VOS, who was employed Radio Paris. VOS lived at No. 61 rue Pontieu, near the Arc de Triomphe. He is about 30 years old, of medium build and recently married a French woman. VOS was apparently very well known to LINDEMANS.

In September 1943, GANDERHEYDEN left Madrid for Gibraltar

RPS Note.

Mr. GANDERHEYDEN left Holland with the assistance of an Organisation known as King Kong. LINDEMANS is favourably known in our records and was identified. News has reached us that LINDEMANS or the KING KONG Org. was penetrated by a certain 'Georges' who may be identical with one J.J. GEORGES who is unfavourably known in our records. However, this is only an assumption on our part and it is by no means established that these two are identical but it would account for the statement made by GANDERHEYDEN that he received a letter while he was waiting in Spain in the beginning of this year, from his people in Holland that LINDEMANS was all right but that 'Chris' was missing.

Mr. VOS mentioned by GANDERHEYDEN was also identified. He also is known to us as a good man. Mr. VOS is apparently also a contact of Chris LINDEMANS.

LINDEMANN appeared to be a person who exaggerated a great deal as he gave vivid descriptions of how he assisted people to escape under the nose of the Gestapo. However, LINDEMANN agreed to assist him and stated that he would take him to France. LINDEMANN agreed to assist both Van HEUKENSFELDT-JANSEN and KREMER to escape. BAARS was to leave earlier. KREMER and Van HEUKENSFELDT-JANSEN were given blank O.T. papers which they had to fill in themselves copying one which LINDEMANN had already filled in. The necessary stamps were already on the paper.

LINDEMANS stated that he would let them know through BAARS' sister when he could take them to France, but they did not get any further advice. They considered that LINDEMANS was extremely unreliable and therefore, meanwhile continued their search for another means of escape.

They were eventually helped to escape to Paris in December ...

At the Hotel des Deux Hemispheres, rue des Martyres, in Paris they were visited by Albert STARING and LINDEMANS as they had come to see other Dutchman. They agreed to help Van HEUKENSFELDT-JANSEN and KREMER, who each paid LINDEMANS 10,000 francs for his services. Van HEUKENSFELDT-JANSEN also exchanged 100 dollars, his three gold pieces and 200 Swiss francs through LINDEMANS and received about 26,000 francs for this money.

Two days later 10.12.43. LINDEMANS moved them to a Pension at 32, Avenue des Termes, Paris, as he considered this a safer place. They remained there until 20.12.43. Meanwhile, LINDEMANS informed them that STARING was inclined to be a fraud as he pocketed the money which was paid for escape services. LINDEMANS stated that he would get them into Spain himself. Van HEUKENSFELDT-JANSEN states that his impression was that each member of the Organisation wished to appear the most important one. SWAENE brought them French Carte d'Identite. Meanwhile, LINDEMANS had left with CELOSI and De GRAAF whilst Van HEUKENSFELDT-JANSEN and KREMER were told that they would rejoin them at Bordeaux. On arrival at Bordeaux they were met at the station by LINDEMANS, CELOSI and De GRAAF.

N.B. The only reason for putting up is the similarity of the name LETUPE, but I suppose it is possible that KING-KONG's name may be VERMEULEN, perhaps S.O.E. could look into this.

26 rue Glichy, should read rue Clichy, DE GRAAF was introduced by CHRISTIAAN @ KING-KONG to "Madame" at 27 rue Clichy, and it was she who sent them on to Bordeaux.

We have another trace of 26 rue Clichy as being the address of Mme. VASIAS, who on 3.11.43 conducted a party of Dutch escapees from Pau to Mauleon (this party were sent by GEORGES @ WYSAGOTA-ZAKRZEWSKI identical with the CLAUDE mentioned to de GRAAF by CHRISTIAAN as having been arrested.) .....The next contact they found was Albert STARING who put them in touch with a friend of his called CHRISTIAAN @ KING KONG. These two apparently belonged to an organisation, partly French and partly Dutch, which helped people across the Pyrenees. Things had been rather difficult on the first evening they arrived in Paris as several arrests within the organisation had taken place that afternoon. CHRISTIAAN took them to the flat of Victor SWAANE, a Dutchman with whom CHRISTIAAN and his wife lived. They were then introduced to "MADAME" of 27 Rue Clichy; source thinks that 27 rue Clichy is "MADAME"'s own address, but that she does not live there permanently as it is too dangerous.

Escape Routes.

a) Witte Brigade.

C.S.6. had a means of exfiltration through the Witte Brigade in BELGIUM. Source did not know how the contact between C.S.6. and the Witte Brigade was worked, but he knew a man called AART ENIVALD who was one of the links between them. This man travelled regularly between AMSTERDAM and PARIS for the Germans and had a German permit; these papers he had copied.

C.S.6. would have tried to send source by this route if he had not been able to go another way, but as it was, they did not get to the stage of planning his journey by this means.

b) Source also knew another man in AMSTERDAM who had special Sicherheitsdienst cards which were valid for unrestricted travel and which he could copy and would give to people wishing to leave the country.

c) The underground paper TROUW has a route from Holland to PARIS. Source says that this was a way from ROTTERDAM to PARIS by O.T. papers, but that the route was becoming more difficult owing to the Germans tightening up their control of O.T. workers owing to a number of desertions, etc. Only R.A.F. pilots knew that a man belonging to HET PAROOL had come that way, also a Captain SUTHERLAND who said that he was an Englishman; DE GRAAF came out this way.

This route was a direct rail one to PARIS, where the contact was CHRISTEN LINDEMANN, who, being a very big man, worked under the nickname of KING KONG. LINDEMANN had a route from PARIS to the PYRANES in conjunction with a French organisation with which the contact was a MADAME..... of 26 rue Clichy, PARIS. The passeur on the later stage to the PYRANES was

On November 16th BOTTENHEIM visited an address which Chris LINDEMANN had given him, M. Van HEEMSTRA, 3 rue Lord Byron. This gentleman was very friendly but said he was just off to Holland and

JEAN BENEDECTINE @ FORD.

Source went to LINDEMANN on arrival in PARIS in December 1943, and LINDEMANN was then living on the Boulevard Victor Hugo. At that time however there were several arrests in the French organisation and LINDEMANN was going to change his address.

Source presumes that he has done this and does not know where he is now living.

Source said that he had not much contact with travel routes in HOLLAND, except during his last few weeks, when he wished to get out himself. He had heard of people going through BELGIUM, and travelling through BRUSSELS with O.T. papers, but he did not know who dealt with them in BRUSSELS, or any further details. Source had never heard of an ex-policeman of the name VAN BILSEN, neither did he know many people in BELGIUM.

VAN VLIET and J.J. GEORGE.

Source said that they learnt the descriptions of probable Gestapo agents by heart. Asked if he knew anything about GEORGE's work, source replied that he only knew of his work with DE GRAAF and G.S.6. When source was in PARIS he heard from CHRISTEN LINDEMANN that GEORGE had been there shortly before and had tried to get to the PYRENEES. He was in PARIS at the same time as source, so source and LINDEMANN went to his address to liquidate him, but he was not there; they then went ~~back~~ to the bar which he frequented, which was opposite the back of the Gestapo Headquarters building, just off the Rue Faubourg, but could not find him there either.

LINDEMANN had told source that he had met a good fellow called GEORGE who was a member of the British Secret Service and could deliver money and arms. Source remembers the C.S.6. story, and asked for description of GEORGE, which was that of the J.J. GEORGE source knew. Source did not know how GEORGE had met LINDEMANN, but said that GEORGE had wanted to go to Spain with LINDEMANN, on the pretence of going to London, but presumably to discover what he could about the escape route. On the day that source and LINDEMANN went to his address GEORGE had gone back to AMSTERDAM. Source did not know of anything that he had done in Holland, other than the C.S.6. arrests.

an important member of a passeurs organisation. She sent them

payment for the assistance rendered.

They experienced no control during the journey and stayed
in Bordeaux until 22.12.43 at a hotel, name forgotten. CHRISTIAAN
