Fieldpost No. 24393P rue Moignac, Toulouse, enabling De GRAAF and CHLOOSSE to travel from Holland to the Pyrenees frontier.

Furthermore CHAMPER gave De GRAAF and CHLOOSSE as a contact in Paris, the man LOWRY BALL. De GRAAF stated further that 13 MAY 1943 Obersturmführer STURM, head of the Gestapo in the Toulouse and Pau districts with quarters in the rue Moignac, Toulouse, was a man who employed numerous Dutchmen including LOWRY BALL to penetrate escape lines. In view of the fact that the documents carried by De GRAAF and CHLOOSSE were obtained from the S.D. rue Moignac, Toulouse, there can be little doubt that they were provided by Obersturmführer STURM. The significance of this does not need labouring.

LINDEMANN's connection with these sinister proceedings is not clear but in view of what Mr. Pinto says and of the confession which has now been obtained from LINDEMANN, it looks very much as though he was playing an active part in the penetration of the escape route from Holland through Paris. When De GRAAF arrived in Paris from Amsterdam which they left on 22.11.43 they went to the Hotel des Deux Hemispheres (referred to above) but were not contacted there. They then called at the Dutch Chamber of Commerce, as CHAMPER had instructed them, to call on Jonkheer De GRAAF. He was not there and they went to the Bureau des Intérêts Néerlandais but could obtain no assistance there as VAN-BAKER and DE WIT had been arrested. They were, however, called on by a Dutch Reserve Officer and chemist of Amstelveen called KROON who had been sent to them by LOWRY BALL. KROON (no doubt at the instigation of BALL) told them to call on Albert STARING and Albert STARIN brought them into contact with KING KONG & Christian. It would accordingly appear that there is close connection between BALL, the Gestapo informer working for the Obersturmführer STURM of Toulouse, and LINDEMANN. Furthermore LINDEMANN took De GRAAF and CHLOOSSE to the flat of Victor SWANE, who is probably identical with the man whose name is in the possession of DEBRAY, who was in turn penetrating the Dutch organisation in Paris.

The possibility that LINDEMANN played a part in the original penetration of the route from Holland which led to the series of arrests referred to above is possibly supported by the fact that Klaus von NEUMANN, well known for his work in Paris for that escape organisation, is a contact of LINDEMANN. Klaus was originally connected with the Dutch Chamber of Commerce and employed at the Netherlands Consulate in Paris and one of the chief members of LINDEMANN's organisation, was likewise a contact of LINDEMANN.

The L.C.C. have been good enough to get out a note of LINDEMANN's known movements which may possibly be of value. They are as follows:

1. HART's sources report a certain de VRIES in June, 1943, as possibly going to Madrid en route for South America on behalf of the S.D. The same message also mentions a Christian, who might be identical with de VRIES, but probably is not.
2. The Dutchman, Ferdinand BAKKER, has been reported from July, 1943, onwards as attached to Amt. VI.F. at Berlin. He visited The Hague in June, 1944, and is known to be connected with the W/T school in Scheveningen. He was last reported on July 12th when he was expecting to return to Berlin.
3. On June 15th BAKKER was informed that a certain WIM was leaving for Holland on the following Wednesday.
4. The same source on June 27th reports a certain WILLY as connected with the S.D. establishment at The Hague.
5. ARNO appears as a signatory of a message from S.D. Berlin in October, 1944. It would seem that he is an H.Q. administrative officer and is, therefore, not likely to be identical with the [ARNO] of LINDEMANS' statement.

LINDEMANS.

1. LINDEMANS remains an exceedingly difficult subject for interrogation, but the information against him is now becoming more coherent. Major Wall-Jaw has summarised progress to date and I am sending it forward, together with descriptions.
2. The salient feature of those papers is that VERLOOP & NELIS free the case of DAAGT in identical with NELIS & DAAGT in the case of LINDEMANS. Copy 020 Interrog Report in the case of DAAGT, Appendix II, Page viii, referr.
3. It will be seen that LINDEMANS lays the blame for his entry into the German Secret Service at the door of VERLOOP. It is now a matter of extreme significance to establish the status of VERLOOP vis-a-vis the British Intelligence Service, and I shall be glad of re-actions at once.
4. I confirm that the above information was telephoned to R.I.B. (Captain Nathan) at 16.15 hours to-day.

First Contact.

End May or beginning June, 1944 - WIM van ~~DENGERE~~, whom LINDEMANS had known previously in Mills in 1942. LINDEMANS states that he met WIM by chance in a cafe in the Place Rogier, at Brussels. At this meeting LINDEMANS told [WIM] that he was out of work and was very hard up. WIM, who at the time was working for a German Canteen in Brussels, suggested that they went into the Black Market together, and that LINDEMANS was to buy a car. This suggestion was turned down by LINDEMANS as he said he had no money. They also talked about LINDEMANS brother, who was in prison.

A short time afterwards, LINDEMANS met WIM again by appointment at a Cafe near the Jardin Botanique. This time WIM was accompanied by another man, (with his small finger missing) called NELIS & BAKER. This latter man told LINDEMANS that he was English and immediately threatened him saying that WIM had reported him as an active member of the Resistance, who had been to Spain, etc. NELIS also told him that he had been given away by various people whom he had helped to escape and who had subsequently been caught by the Germans.

Some days later, at approximately 23.00 hours, he was picked up near the Jardin Botanique in a car by NELIS and a certain WILLY. LINDEMANS was now taken to a large house on the road, he believes, to Waterloo. This house was full of Germans in uniform, but LINDEMANS was taken by NELIS and WILLY to a room where he was introduced to a man called VOGLER, and subsequently to a Dr. GERMAN dressed in white twill. This last man said to start with that he was a Swede, but LINDEMANS subsequently learnt he was German. Dr. GERMAN again told LINDEMANS that they knew all about his history and his wife's and brother's imprisonment, and that his sole means of saving himself was to work for the Germans. LINDEMANS on being presented with this ultimatum, agreed to work for them. Later Dr. GERMAN promised to free both his wife and brother.

Contract.

LINDEMANS states that he signed no contract at this meeting, nor at any other time to work for the German I.S.

Say Name.

CHRISTIAAN. Also known as BRAND. (the name under which he worked in the Resistance group) to the German I.S.

Cornelis VERHOOF & PHILIP (France) de BAKER (Brussels). NELIS (Holland).

Nationality: Dutch. Age about 35. Build: slim. Height: 1m65. Hair: dark. Eyes: black, piercing. No glasses. Complexion: white. Skin burnt at his neck. Has burn scars on his hands, and his little finger on his right hand is missing. Languages: French, Dutch, English, German (all very fluent), some Norwegian.

Payments.

Made by WILLY, usually in some cafe by previous arrangement. Between 30,000 and 40,000 Belgian Francs in all received at various times. Receipts signed "CHRISTIAAN".

Training.

NIL.

Mission.

LINDEMANS' main task was to keep in touch with the Brigade Blanche and to find out from his chief, the exact date and time when the Belgian Resistance Movement was to rise in conjunction with the Allies. He was also to report the whereabouts of his chief, but this LINDEMANS states he never did, in fact on one occasion he warned his chief in a cafe that he was being watched by WILLY. Other matters on which he had to report were the state of readiness and equipment of the Resistance Group.

Other Contacts.

At the beginning of July, 1944, NELIS left Brussels for Holland and is reported to have bought a cafe at Amsterdam (address unknown). LINDEMANS states that NELIS lives in the house of an undertaker in Overtoom, Amsterdam. He is now working for Eins C. in Holland.

On NELIS's departure all LINDEMANS's dealings took place with WILLY. They met at an appointed rendez-vous, usually some small cafe two or three times a week. WILLY was sometimes accompanied by VOGLER. Dr. GERMAN was only seen two or three times, once in the uniform of a Lieutenant Colonel. The latter lived in the house on the Waterloo Road. P.F.601.712

LINDEMANS, although not certain, thinks WIM works for the German I.S. He is reported to know many German agents. Is married to a German.

Met at the Hotel Royal Nord, Brussels, July, 1944. Another woman, Akke HOLCOMB, said Mia worked for the Gestapo.

Trip to Eindhoven.

At the beginning of October, LINDEMANS states he set out with a small party under Captain BAKER to go from Antwerp to Eindhoven. The route taken was via Diest-Bourg Leopold. At the latter place, Capt. BAKER fell out and told LINDEMANS to report to de VRIES, de JUNGÉ and de KOENIG (Commissaire de Police) at Eindhoven.

On reaching Valkenswaard (South of Eindhoven) LINDEMANS was arrested by two German parachutists and taken to a cafe nearby and interrogated. He was then taken to a large chateau near Hertogenbosch, belonging to a van BEUNINGEN, which LINDEMANS states was the Army H.Q. of Brabant. Here he was again interrogated and said that he was working

for the Germans. Asked why he had not got the password for the day, he stated he had forgotten it and asked to be put in touch with the Wehrmacht or with WILLY or PAUL GERMAN. He was then taken by car to Driebergen, where he was interviewed by a fat German, whom LINDEMANS describes as a Lieutenant.

Information given to the German Lieutenant.

LINDEMANS admits that he gave the German officer information on Allied troops, tanks, etc. and possibly the name of Captain RIKER. The next day he was taken back to the region of Eindhoven to re-cross the Allied lines. He was given the password of "BONIFACIUS".

LINDEMANS denies any knowledge of the location of the H.Q. 21 Army Group, 2nd British Army or 1st Canadian Army.

Other Enemy Agents.

[Captain JACKSON] 1397/Belgi-16.

LINDEMANS states that he had received orders from Commandant George ANLAUK to find Captain JACKSON and kill him, as he was known to be working for the Gestapo. Commandant Albert CONINCK, of Mechelsche (Malines) Steenweg, now at Charleroi, can give a description of this man. Now probably working in Holland.

van den BERG (1).

Possibly working in Holland.

Private Address at Brussels.

Whilst in Brussels, LINDEMANS lived at the Hotel Royal ~~SCARDEN~~ Nord. LINDEMANS paid his own hotel bill and was largely financed by a Monsieur ~~WAAL~~, a rich grain merchant at Malines, from whom he collected money ostensibly for his work with the Orange Movement.

Other Activities.

LINDEMANS states that during the time he was employed by the German I.S., he continued to carry out sabotage on behalf of the Brigade Blanche. This he states can be confirmed by Commandant REINERS, the Chief at Antwerp. He again asserts that on no occasion did he give either the name of any member of the Resistance Group or of any Allied airmen to the Germans.



CHARLES LINDEMANS OF ALMENRODE

1. This obstreperous giant was taken over at Oxford City Police Station at 09.00 hours on 3.11.44. The American officer reported trouble en route, which resulted in this man being bound. An outside in handcuff failed to fit him and for this reason he was sent to Camp 020 still bound. He was unbound on arrival. At 16.00 hours he threw a fit, but quietened later.
2. I confirm my telephone conversation with M.L.B (Mr. Stamp) to say that the case was extremely slanderous. On the one hand there was the unsupported denunciation by VELLOP. On the other hand his file and all his documents were clearly in his favour. Indeed they showed a long history of excellent service on behalf of the Resistance Movement in Holland. There was the added complication that this man appears to be personally quite with Prince Bernhard. Mr. Stamp replied that endeavours were being made to fly VELLOP over to this country. In the circumstances I thought it well for this man to be affected by the prison atmosphere for as long as possible pending the arrival of VELLOP. I therefore deferred interrogation.
3. At 21.00 hours Col. Salmon informed me that he had received a message on the Scrabbler from B.I.B (Mr. Milne). It was to the effect that 21 Army Group were anxious to ascertain whether LINDEMANS knew the whereabouts of the British Commander-in-Chief and of H.Q. of 21 Army Group, and again whether he had passed on this information to the Germans. I reconsidered the general position and decided to interrogate LINDEMANS at once. It then transpired that the Medical Officer in the meantime had seen LINDEMANS and had prescribed Lachinol treatment. It further appears that there is also a history of insanity. I therefore got in touch with the Medical Officer and he agreed with me that interrogation in the circumstances was justified but that the conditions were hardly favourable.
4. I interrogated LINDEMANS from 21.40 hours until 23.50 hours. He proved extremely difficult and no conviction of any kind was obtained during the first hour. The final result, however, has been obtained in the form of a signed confession, translation of which is attached, and it indicates that the denunciation made by VELLOP is substantially accurate.
5. I confirm that a message was sent over the Scrabbler at 20.15 hours on 4.11.44 by Lt. Col. Atkinson to P.I.P. A copy is attached, and deals in particular with the issue of the whereabouts of the Commander-in-Chief and 21 Army Group.
6. Among the points of importance which have not been reduced to writing are the following:-

LINDEMANS worked for an S.S. organization, and was emphatic about this. He adds that he saw a paper with "S.S." written upon it in ~~WILHELM~~'s possession. He had lived with one H.H. of the Gestapo, but stated that he did not know this fact unimportant. His argument was that he could not be expected to know, as she was an a

6. At the time that Eindhoven fell, I went to Hertogenbosch and Driebergen. (I was to give a report to a German Commandantur about the areas liberated by the English troops.)
7. [ARDO] brought me back to near Eindhoven and he belonged to the Gestapo.

At 3.30 p.m. had a black out.

He gives the history of having fractured his skull seven years ago in a car accident. He was unconscious for some time. He then became mental and was in an asylum for eighteen months. He tells me that he gets these attacks every two to four months.

The Temperature is normal and pulse now very good.

His blood pressure is not raised. This shows that he is not having a haemorrhage into his Brain.

Treatment.

If he is kept quiet for two days he should then be all right for interrogation.

It would be advisable to X-Ray his head when the X-Ray people are next down here.

He has had other injuries.
