





I. Names of Prominent Dutchmon arrested through RIDDERGOF and LIEDERGOS.

(a) RIDDETHOF.

A Dutch university professor, middle-aged, living at Leist (?), whose name GISHES cannot remember, was in the Autumn of 1943 arrested whilst trying to cross into Belgium. REDUENHOF had reported beforehand that the Professor was being sent by the "Bram von CONO" group in Doorn to England via Spain with information. He travelled on the same route as AFOLLO of the "Nordpol" case. On his arrest by the Sipo. it was confirmed that he was in possession of important espionage material.

(b) Christian LINDIMANS.

A Belgian priest (name forgottom), some time in April 1944, come to Rotterdam with a mission from a Belgian Resistance Group in order to hold a conference with a Butch Escape Organization which was already known. After LENDEMANS had reported on the priest, he was arrested.

- III. Names of Resistance or Esplonage Group Leaders, and how they were arrested.
- (a) Admiral QUARDY, an O.D. leader, was arrested in 1941 by the Sipo.
- (b) A director of the accordance factory FORKER in Austerdam, name forgotten, was arrested in 1943 by the Sipo during the breaking up of a Resistance and Espionege Group in Amsterdam.
- (c) A schoolmaster called JUJEN was arrested in the Summer of 1943 at Bergen op Zoom as a leader of an espionage group. He was known to Illf. and Sipo because in the "Northeel" affair, London gave his name as a contact.
- (d) A Dutch reserve G.S. officer (name forgetten) domiciled at The Hague, was, according to the Sire, arrested in November 1941 as the leader at that time of the C.D.
- (e) Gept. 2008ER; a"Doctor SOCMER" was, according to a report which resched III. in the Spring of 1942, active in the resistance group and was said to be dominited in Breis. Details of his activities were not incom. According to reports in the Spring of 1945 (from Dutch Resistance circles) 2008ER had, in the meantime, become chief of the Dutch I.S. in London. He was identified as the Dutch Major 200MER, formerly instructor in the Dutch Military Accdemy in Breds. IV. Names of prominent people surgeted in Belgium.

In the middle of 1944, the head of the Intelligence Service ZERO was arrested (cover nows ROULEAU). The arrest was occasioned by the penetration of the group by the G.F.P. in Brussels. PAT. 362 also had a contact with the ROULEAU Group but it came to nothing. Details of other Abwehr agents in Brussels can only be given by the Trupps who handled them.

V. Information on British I.S., appointments, names of officers, units, agents' schools, instruction and courses.

There was copicus information on the shove in the files of Leitstelle IIIf. and FAKs. The Sipo also had a profound knowledge of the subject, especially as regards training of agents in England. Exchanging of information between IIIf. and the Sipo was exceptional. Information of this nature, in the possession of IIIf. and later FATs, and FAKs was passed to Abw. III, Berlin, and later to the Leitstelle III-West fuer Frontauffclasrung. Abw. III. Berlin and later III-West correlated the information received, and issued from time to time, summaries regarding new information, and full therets of the British 1.3. These works of reference were always available, and consequently, neither HIMTEMANN nor GISKER carried such in their heads.

S.C.E. was known to be the organisers of secret action (secret operations executive, secret overseas expeditions). Among others, were the following sections - Dutch, French, Selgian, Norwegian, Spanish, Italian, and probably German. The work of the sections was training, equipment and the despatch of agents to their particular countries on sabotage missions, and the oreating, arming and leading of sabotage and Resistance groups. The following names in the Dutch Section are remembered: - It.Col. BLUNT and his Secretary, Miss BOND, also his successor, Major BINGHAM; also the name of Lt. KNIGHT.

About Schools, the following are remambered: Patriotic Schools (vetting), Parachute School at Kingway, and a sabotage school on a small island in Scotland. W/T and cypher school in London. The Luftwaffe knew two airfields in Eagland from whomes agents were despatched.

The R.D.F. service (Fluke-Morchdienst) of the Luftwaffe knew some of the call-signs of the A/C which carried agents. From the interception of this traffic before the seroplane started (it is believed during practice flights in the afternoon before a mission) the operation of the night often became known. The Fluke-Morchdienst of the luftwaffe had special instructions to report on low-flying A/C and especially those druiding in certain areas. The combination of the information received from the Funkhorels and the Fluke-Morchlienet enabled the areas to be caushished in which regular parachuting A/C operated, and thus gave a picture of the parachute operations which had been carried out. At the H.Q. of the Feld and Oberfeldkommunicaturen and in some cases of Ortakommunicaturen and Flukehamptstellen, motorised columns were kept alert for action where parachute operations had been observed, and could with certainty be presumed to have taken place. The results, however, were magne for the following reason. The alert was given too late, reports on the locality of the operation were too insecurate, last of petrol, too great a distance to cover to reach the locality of the operation. Only one case where these columns succeeded is known, namely, in France in the Antumn of 1943 (? morr Chartree) which resulted in the arrest of several agents in a car who had just left the dropping ground.






