VERLOOP wrote a letter about his dissatisfaction at remaining inactive which was taken by DAMEN who was leaving for Holland, and was eventually handed to Major KIESEWETTER, GISKES's successor at Driebergen. As a result VERLOOP was instructed to remain in Brussels as Dr. GERHARD would shortly be arriving and would give him other employment. VERLOOP also accused GISKES of being a homo-sexual.	VERLOOP
March 1944.	VERLOOP met LINDEMANS, who wished to give the Abwehr all the information he could on the Resistance movements if his brother and mistress were released from prison by the Germans. VERLOOP telephoned his chief GISKES who summoned him to Driebergen to report. GISKES, who was delighted at the recruiting of LINDEMANS, instructed VERLOOP to return to Brussels and arrange a meeting with LINDEMANS. The meeting took place and after LINDEMANS had obtained the word of honour of GISKES that his brother and mistress would be set free, he gave him information on the Resistance movements in Belgium and Holland. Under the instructions of GISKES' assistants he telephoned various agents and arranged meetings with them. LINDEMANS however states that the meeting with VERLOOP took place in April and the one with GISKES in May. All his meetings with Abwehr officials were arranged by telephone with either GISKES or his assistant WILLY. According to LINDEMANS GISKES is a personal friend of HITLER. During May LINDEMANS was taken to Driebergen by VERLOOP and was shown a card containing names of Resistance workers, he gave GISKES information on them. On one occasion LINDEMANS was accidentally shot by the S.D. and with GISKES knowledge and help planned a rescue from the hospital, as a result many resistance workers were captured. GISKES instructed LINDEMANS not to have anyone arrested until he knew all details of the route for which they were working, and also gave him permission to penetrate any route in order to gain information about the main resistance group. LINDEMANS when in Brussels was always shadowed by Wim van der MEER and had to report all his movements to GISKES. According to GISKES, LINDEMANS had said that the invasion of the Low countries would take place end of May or beginning of June.

Aug. 1944. GISKES sent LINDEMANS to Liege to obtain information on Allied parachutists said to have been dropped in the Ardennes and the activities of the Resistance Group in Liege. LINDEMANS failed to obtain the necessary information.

22.8.44 GISKES, head of Kdo 307, sent a message from Cologne to Oberleutnant REILE, head of Abt. III at the Paris station, which had moved to St. Meneshould, on the activities of a proven agent, probably LINDEMANS. An obscure feature of this last report is that though it was despatched to Oberstlt. GISKES, head of 307 from Cologne it was sent to the head of Kdo 306 to pass to REILE.

1 Sept. 1944 LINDEMANS' last contact with GISKES, was just before the Allies entered Brussels.

LINDEMANS who had been sent on a mission to Brussels, was caught en route by German soldiers and having forgotten the pass word, asked to be put in touch with GISKES, he was eventually taken to Driebergen. GISKES had told LINDEMANS that in the event of the German H.Q. having to move from Driebergen, he would find him at the Hotel Sterne at Elten near Nymegen.

I refer to your letter CX .5G.2 of February 19th and I return herewith your copy of the Dutch interrogation of H.J. GISKES. I am sending you also a translation of all the passages in this interrogation report which appear to refer to W.J. HOOPER. We have kept a copy of this translation for our own file and I hope to discuss this with John Marriott who is away at the moment. So far as I can recollect we have had most of this information about HOOPER before, though his offer of the "VANSITTART" source to the Germans was never before described in such detail. I find it hard to believe that the Germans did not take some action about PIECK beyond clapping him into a Concentration camp. Perhaps some day we may lay our hands on their interrogation of PIECK in relation to HOOPER's story.

If GISKES is still available, we would be very grateful if he could be questioned on the following matter.

We have recently seen a copy of the French interrogation report regarding Richard CHRISTMANN & ARNAUD who worked for Abwehr III F in Holland under GISKES. CHRISTMANN gave the following information regarding one of his agents, apparently an Englishman, about whom we are anxious to have more details:

"LUKAS, alias "LOENEN" de la securite anglaise, fut fait prisonnier à Dunkerque après avoir travaillé pour l'Abwehr de Cologne. Il m'avait été transféré en mars 1942. Pour le punir de différentes indiscrétions faites au detriment des Hollandais et du service, il fut assigné par moi au camp de prisonniers de passage à WESEL pour être dirigé dans un camp de prisonniers anglais en Pologne. Le commandant du camp, avisé par nos soins des services qu'il avait rendus lui accorda un traitement de faveur et lui donna des missions de confiance à l'intérieur du camp."

You may care to have the attached copy of a letter which I have sent to Stephens concerning GISERS.

Stephens gave me a list of a number of the present German inmates of Camp 020 whom he considered he could utilise in one capacity or another at his new establishment. A number of prisoners who had come to us from the Americans were included, amongst them GISERS; I explained to Stephens that we could not let him have all of these, but that I thought I could possibly arrange without any great difficulty for an exception to be made concerning GISERS. This I have in fact been able to do with Saxe.

Although I have left it to Stephens to obtain the necessary clearance from 21st Army Group, I think it is desirable that the actual Movement Order or paper should be received by us direct from you. This will probably be your view as well.
