SUBJECT: HUNDEMANN, Gerhard, Gottfried, Eduard      MIC Case 2313  
Alias Freddy WEBER, alias HAENSEN.

1. Subject, a German national from HAMBURG and member of FAK 307 gave himself up to the American forces on 13 April 1945 near LUEDENSHIEID, and was arrested on 17 April 1945 by the 301st CI C Detachment at PFE, Memory 5. Interrogation revealed that Subject had been active in the Abwehr in Holland and Belgium from December 1941 until March 1944, at which time he became a member of FAK 307. Subject has a tremendous amount of information and is talking willingly.

BACKGROUND.

2. Subject was born on 21 October 1901 in HAMBURG. He attended elementary and high school until the age of 19. He then became an employee in an export firm in HAMBURG for 2 years, went to a chemical concern for 6 months near BERLIN and then returned for 3 months to HAMBURG where he again worked in an export firm. In May 1924 Subject got a position with POPPE and Co in GUAYAQUIL, Ecuador, where he worked for about 8 months. He then moved to VALPARAISO, Chile where he worked for the COMPAÑIA SALTERRA DE TOCOPILLA until June 1925. At that time Subject's father, who was the owner of an export firm in HAMBURG, died and Subject returned to HAMBURG to take charge of the business. In 1930 Subject opened a branch in ROTTERDAM, Holland, which did not prove to be successful and was dissolved the next year. In 1932 the entire firm was forced to liquidate, mainly because of the unfavorable economic situation. Subject lived at the house of a friend and colleague, the owner of the firm SCHOLVIN and Co of CALCUTTA, in GHOSH FLOTBECK near HAMBURG. He worked on odd jobs, but was actually supported by his friend's family. In 1935 Subject got a position as paymaster on the German-Africa line which position he held until 1937. At that time he accepted a position as branch manager for G.L. GAISER in LAGOS, Liberia. One year later he became representative of the LEISS shipping Company and opened another branch in PORT HARCOURT, Liberia. On 6 January 1939 Subject returned to Germany, mainly because he wanted a better position. He had already made a contract with the SOCIEDAD ANONIMA DRUMEN in BARCELONA, which in fact was a German firm (formerly New Guinea Co).

INITIAL CONTACT WITH ABWEHR

3. Subject was stranded in Germany when the war started, and could not return to Liberia. He was thus forced to look out for another source of income. A friend of his told Subject that in BERLIN, at 20 Budapest Strasse, people were wanted who had knowledge of one or more foreign languages. Subject was immediately accepted and started working in the Auslandsbriefprüfstelle (Censorship Office) in BERLIN as colonial specialist. Subject worked here for a considerable time, and was transferred in July 1940 to a similar function in COPENHAGEN, Denmark. Here Subject came to realize that he would soon be inducted in the German army. Since he was none too anxious to become a front line soldier, he discussed this matter with a former colleague of his, Miss Adrienne VON EHRENBACH, who in the meantime had been transferred to PARIS. Miss EHRENBACH knew GISKES, at that time connected with Ast Paris. She convinced GISKES that Subject was an extremely useful man, whereupon the former notified the military authorities that Subject, upon

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induction, should be assigned to the Abwehr. On 6 November 1941 Subject was inducted in the 3 Co Landesschuetzen Bns. Bn III. After a short basic training course Subject was transferred on 10 December 1941 to SCHEVENINGEN, Holland, where he reported to GISKES, who in the meantime had also been transferred to Holland from France.

## ACTIVITIES IN HOLLAND.

4. When Subject reported to Major GISKES at 10 Hoogeweg in SCHVENTINGEN, he immediately sent him back home, in order to get civilian clothing. Subject returned a few days later and was introduced to several co-workers: Hptm BUSSÉ, Sdr Z JAACKS, and Oberlt WURR, all working in III F at the above address. His initial mission was to get acquainted with general Abwehr matters and for the first 8 weeks Subject had an opportunity to study all available documents and cases. On or about 12 March 1942 Subject got the mission to proceed with Sdr JAACKS to HILVERSUM, to assist the SD (IV E of the Gestapo) with a raid. On 16 March 1942 the raid was conducted on the Nederlandsche Seintoestellen Fabriek (Radio Factory), and an engineer, SLOOF, and several others were arrested. They were accused of having built illegal R/T sets. This case was solved by Sdr JAACKS and ORTHMANN from the Gestapo. SLOOF tried to escape during capture. In the resulting gun battle, Subject was slightly wounded in both legs. He was in a hospital 4 weeks as a result of these wounds. After discharge from the hospital, he got 10 days leave to BERLIN.

## "NORDPOL"

5. In early March 1948 Subject received a message from Major GISKES, written in German, with the instruction to translate this in imperfect English (as spoken by a foreigner). This message contained certain information about a "reception committee". Subject translated this message and a few days later received an English message from GISKES to be translated into German. This continued for some time, until Subject was briefed by GISKES about the true state of affairs.

6. Willy KUP, at that time an agent for the Abwehr had met a certain George RIDDERHOFF, who had been in prison and there had met a member of the Dutch underground. Upon RIDDERHOFF's release this cell mate had given him a message for this Dutch underground member. This information was passed on by RIDDERHOFF to KUP, who in turn informed Major GISKES about it. GISKES did not believe RIDDERHOFF's subsequent story that an Allied plane would shortly appear and drop agents and sabotage equipment in a certain area and told him "to go to the Nordpol". This explains the name of the subsequent affair. Nevertheless RIDDERHOFF was ordered to try to penetrate this organization and shortly afterwards he was able to report that at HOOGHALEN near ASSEN, Holland certain sabotage equipment would be dropped by parachute. This equipment was in fact dropped, and RIDDERHOFF took the explosives to his house in ARNHEM. Shortly afterwards RIDDERHOFF was able to determine the identity and whereabouts of the w/t operator of this organization. At the same time the "B" (Beobachtung-Observation) Stelle of the Orpo (interception and direction finder unit) in SCHEVENINGEN was instructed to double check this information. Shortly afterwards (Subject believes in March 1942) KUP took into custody w/t agent Hubertus LAUWERS, living in THE HAGUE, and handed him over to the Gestapo (IV E). GISKES obtained the permission to talk to LAUWERS which was rather unusual, since all interrogations were performed by the Gestapo, without interference by the Abwehr. GISKES was able to "turn" LAUWERS, after having given him the assurance that none of the agents coming from England would be executed for espionage.

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7. Every second day, LAUWERS was taken out of the prison in SCHIEVENINGEN, in order to send his messages, under supervision of the Orpo. In April 1942 a message was received that an agent would be dropped near STEENWYK. The Abwehr notified the Gestapo and this agent, was taken into custody immediately upon landing. This man's alias was ABOR, his real name is unknown to Subject. At about the same time the Gestapo took JORDAAN, Han, w/t agent and TAONIS into custody, mainly as a result of LAUWERS' interrogation. JORDAAN was also "broken" by the Gestapo and a second w/t station was started by the Abwehr in SCHIEVENINGEN (JORDAAN's call sign PZAD). Thus, for two years the Abwehr could communicate with England. A total of 42 agents were taken into custody, immediately upon landing. At the height of the scheme as many as 13 w/t sets were operated by the Abwehr in AMSTERDAM, THE HAGUE, UTRECHT, DRIEBERGEN, S'HERTOGENBOSCH, ARNHEM, NOORDWIJK and HOOGE OF HOLLAND. Approximately 900 messages were thus received and sent by the Abwehr. Whenever a plane was due from England, the air force and anti-aircraft units were notified to let it pass unharmed, and the few planes which may have been shot down were due to errors and misunderstanding of orders.

8. Espionage instructions were received and answered with partly correct information received from the army, but which was to a great extent misleading and false. Instructions for sabotage were sometimes carried out. For instance Subject recalls the message instructing the organization to blow up the radio transmitter in KOOTWIJK. Several Abwehr members were sent down there at the exact time and with a great display of fireworks acted as if a real raid were taking place. That same evening the "organization" reported to England that the raid was carried out as ordered, that it had not succeeded because of the careful guarding of the surroundings and that several members were killed or captured. The following day all newspapers published a message from General CHRISTIANSEN stating that underground terrorists had attempted to blow up Radio KOOTWIJK but that thanks to the alert guards the raid had proved a failure. It went on to say that several members were killed and captured.

9. Another case of actual sabotage was carried out in the harbor of ROTTERDAM. An old elevator was towed through the harbor with German planes, which were made to look like a brand new shipment. In the center of the river MAAS, between the two bridges in the center of the city this elevator was blown up with the result that it turned over together with all the loaded planes. This happened on a sunny Sunday morning, and was cheered by thousands of enthusiastic Dutchmen who were under the genuine impression that the Dutch underground had performed a grand feat of effective sabotage. Other cases of genuine sabotage were committed on the railroads. The real motive for the Abwehr was that they were afraid of a possible brother underground organization which might be able to counter-check certain information which had been reported to England.

10. A real complication arose when England instructed the organization to have one or more members return for discussions. The Germans invented a cover story for every agent concerned, explaining that it was impossible for him to return at the present time. RIDDERHOF was then instructed to look for a real member of the Dutch underground (OB), who would be completely ignorant of the fact that he was being sent by the Germans. RIDDERHOF found such a man in Sgt KNOPPERS, of BLARICUM, assistant to Col KOPPERT. The Germans asked England for permission to send this man who was genuinely interested in contacting the Allies in England, and when the message was received that he could be sent, he was dispatched via the route stipulated by the English service. Subject emphatically states that KNOPPERS never realized that he was being used by the Abwehr as a decoy and that he is a genuine Dutch patriot, in no way connected with the Abwehr.

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11. Another time when RIDDERHOFF successfully used his penetration of the Dutch underground was in the case of an American air force captain, who was shot down and who was hidden by the Dutch underground for several weeks. RIDDERHOFF brought him in contact with the existing escape organization whose members were all known to the Abwehr, since they were given by one of the agents who had arrived from England and who was "broken". This Captain successfully completed his trip and safely arrived in England.

12. The English one day proposed to send a plane down to land in Holland and instructed the organization to find a suitable landing point. The SD decided to select a field but to mine it, so that the plane would blow up upon landing. GISKES refused this plan and thereupon it was suggested to England to send a flying boat. It was intended to have it land on the Zuiderzee and to have it captured by some fishing boats. This plan was abandoned by England, who then suggested to send a PT boat to ENGELMANSPLAAT, a small uninhabited island in Northern Holland. The plan was to capture this boat, since the German navy was extremely anxious to get such a specimen intact. This plan too, however, was later abandoned by England, whereupon an agent was parachuted down, with full information and addresses of an escape route.

13. A certain genuine British agent named NIERMEIER (whose call sign was OFX) was of great concern to the Germans, since he escaped detection for almost a year. They were never able to pin him down, because he changed location continuously and everybody was instructed to concentrate on this man. One day the Germans received order to submit money and new code instructions to a certain address in AMSTERDAM. This address was unknown to the Abwehr and was immediately submitted to the Gestapo. The Gestapo took this man into custody, and upon interrogation found out that he was the operator of the OFX station.

14. For two years the Abwehr was thus able to supply the British with false information and to paint an entirely untrue picture of the extent and activities of Dutch underground organizations. Subject and GISKES both received Kriegsverdienstkreuz mit Schwertern I Class. A total of 94 missions were flown by the Allies, 42 agents were parachuted and up to 18 w/t stations were operated by the Abwehr.

15. All captured agents were taken to a former monastery near HAAREN. About Nov 1943 two prisoners, DOURLIN and UBBING succeeded in escaping and apparently reached Switzerland safely. Towards December 1943 Subject began to grow suspicious of the messages which were received from England. His suspicion grew since no more agents were parachuted and no more planes came over to drop sabotage equipment. In March 1944, HEINTJE, a British agent was arrested and a message was found in his property, warning him of a sister organization which was penetrated by the Germans. This information was forwarded by the British Military Attaché in Switzerland, who notified England, who in turn notified HEINTJE. The Germans deduced from this that DOURLIN and UBBING had been able to reach Switzerland successfully and warn the British about the true state of affairs. About one month later the Abwehr received instructions from the RSHA to terminate the communication with a message which read about as follows: "We have noticed that for some time you have been doing business in Holland without our assistance. As your solo agents for a long time, we think this rather unfair. But never mind, if you ever try to pay us an armed visit, you can rest assured that you will get the same reception as your agents".

## S E C R E T

## SD PENETRATION ACTIVITIES.

16. Subject relates a story which occurred approximately at the same time as the Nordpol affair. He is not certain about the facts since this matter was handled exclusively by the SD and all the information was "hearsay". Kriminalrat SCHREIEDER, chief of IV B, had an agent, ABEN, who was captain of an SS Hollandia which made regular trips between DELFTZYL, Holland and STOCKHOLM, Sweden. This Captain ABEN took information from the Dutch underground to the British Military Attaché in Stockholm and returned with new instructions, which were promptly delivered to SCHREIEDER. ABEN took a certain JONKHEER VAN GEEVERS DEINWOOD to STOCKHOLM, with the knowledge of SCHREIEDER who hoped that he would return to Holland with important information and could then be used by the Germans. No further details are known to Subject, and he is not too certain about the reliability of this story.

## REORGANIZATION OF ABWEHR.

17. In March 1944 a complete reorganization of the Abwehr was effected. All members of III F were incorporated in FAK 307 and FAT 365. III H, III L and III M were attached to the Military Commander in Holland. III C, III W and III N were incorporated into the SD and transferred to WIJNEMERGEN. The entire III F personnel, with the exception of GISKES, Hptm WURR, Uffz. KUP, Uffz. HANF and Subject were incorporated into INT 365, while the above mentioned personalities were incorporated into FAK 307 and transferred to BRUSSELS, Place de l'Industrie. Major RUDLOFF joined FAK 307, after giving up his post with INT PARIS, while Hptm Dr. GROSSE came over from INT BRUSSELS.

## ACTIVITIES IN BELGIUM

18. Subject was instructed by GISKES to contact the various Trupps in Belgium. He visited LIEGE (INT 363), GHENT (INT 364), ANTWERP (INT 364), LILLE (INT 363). In contrast to Holland, where radio interception was carried out by the Orpo, this mission in Belgium was performed by a special unit OKW WNW Fu and Funkueberwachungs Kp 616 (medium wave) and 615 (short wave). These units were deployed throughout France and Belgium.

## DACIER CASE.

19. In April 1944 INT 362 and the radio interception units discovered the existence of a w/t agent in LILLE who was arrested a few days later. This man was interrogated and he furnished the information that his mission was only to send messages while another person in LILLE received the instructions from England. This latter individual was also arrested by the Germans. Both agents stated that their chief was a man named CLEMENT. About three weeks prior to the arrest of the two agents, CLEMENT, whose real name is DACIER, was arrested in PARIS by Uffz NIEHOFF, member of FAT 362. The reason for arrest had no connection with the w/t agents at that time, since DACIER was denounced by one of NIEHOFF's agents who had penetrated DACIER's organization, and had been sent by the latter with a message to PARIS. Subject was instructed by GISKES to proceed to PARIS in order to talk to DACIER and to determine whether or not this man could be turned and used by the Germans. Subject reported to the SD in PARIS and received information that DACIER was a key agent who had been parachuted into France at least twice, and who had once been picked up by a British plane in France. He added that DACIER was unwilling to talk although he undoubtedly had extremely valuable information. Subject received permission to talk to DACIER on 20 April 1944 and determined immediately that he could not be used by the Germans, since two other w/t operators in the same organization had been able to report the

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arrest of the two men in LILLE and had also reported DACIER's disappearance. Subject claims to have been greatly impressed by DACIER's courage and patriotism and also by the way DACIER's wife, who was pregnant and also under arrest, was standing up under this strain. Subject reported back to GISKES in BRUSSELS that he saw a possibility of employing DACIER with the thought in mind of getting him out of the hands of the SD (Gestapo) in PARIS. With great difficulty GISKES was able to have DACIER and wife released to him. Subject returned to LILLE on 1 May with the two prisoners, and took them to the prison in that city. Shortly afterwards Mme DACIER, who in reality was his mistress (her true name was Henriette GILLES), was to give birth any moment, and Subject succeeded in having her transferred to a hospital where the child was born. Subject continued to tell GISKES and the SD in PARIS by promising still to see the possibilities of organizing illegal w/t connection with England. However in the long run Subject could not continue with this promise without producing results, and he produced a new angle on the case, stating that he could penetrate the organization with the help of an existing mail box. His motive for helping these two French subjects was, according to Subject's statements, pure friendship and sympathy and his sincere wish to save their lives by keeping them out of the hands of the Gestapo. As a matter of fact, Subject believes that DACIER was never evacuated by the Germans but was found by the Americans when they entered LILLE on 1 September 1944. He is certain that Mme GILLES was left behind and was able to rejoin her family. DACIER was department chief of the BOA (Bureau d'Operations Aeriennes) for the Pas de Calais and Nord departments. The address given to Subject by DACIER at which the latter could be contacted after the war is: Mme CHA-MALEILLES, 43 Rue Mercerie, MONTELIER, Drpmc. This is the address of Mme GILLES' mother. (Note: Pertinent information about Subject could most probably obtained at the above address).  
LILLE KARILLE

20. In August 1944 PAT 362 and the Überwachungs Kp 615 discovered a short wave w/t operator in a little village in the vicinity of LILLE. The operator's name was LACQUEMANT. This individual "turned" immediately and stated he was prepared to continue to operate if he could save his life. He was in touch with a plane which cruised over Northern France between 2400 and 0200. After 10 unsuccessful attempts, radio-telephonic communication was established with this plane. One day prior to the occupation of LILLE by Allied forces, this plane, following information from this agent, dropped 8 containers of weapons near a little village at about 72 miles distance from LILLE. Subject lost LACQUEMANT during the confusion in LILLE and believes that he must have reported his adventures to the Allies when they entered the city. The weapons which were dropped were distributed by Subject to the fleeing German forces. He returned to BRUSSELS which he left a few hours ahead of the advancing Allies. He proceeded on 4 September 1944 and September 1944, about 15 Allied w/t agents were arrested by the Germans.

CASE: "C.C."

CHRISTIAN LINDEMAN(N)

21. Shortly after termination of the "Nordpol" case, GISKES told Subject that he had been very fortunate to get a very important agent, named "C.C.". This man approached GISKES and told him that he was a British agent and that his brother had been arrested by the Gestapo and was in prison in SCHEVENINGEN. He declared that he was willing to work for the Germans, if GISKES could manage to have his brother released from prison. GISKES discussed this matter with SCHREIDER, and a few days afterwards C.C.'s brother was released and returned to ROTTERDAM. C.C. was being run by Uffz. KUP. Subject is not very familiar with this case because it was exclusively handled by GISKES himself and by KUP. He does know,

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however, that C.C. was an extremely important penetration agent, who successfully operated in Holland and Belgium and who had penetrated many underground organizations. At the end of September 1944, while in DRIEBERGEN, Subject met C.C., who had just crossed the lines in the EINDHOVEN sector. He was immediately interrogated by Major KLESEWETTER. The following story is merely hearsay and Subject does not know the exact details: C.C. is supposed to have been in Allied Headquarters in the Hotel Metropole in BRUSSELS, where he was in contact with prominent officers. He had received instructions to contact certain key leaders of the Dutch underground in EINDHOVEN. He is also supposed to have been able to supply certain details about plans of an Allied airborne invasion. KLESEWETTER then immediately sent him to EINDHOVEN in order to contact these underground leaders, and gave him the mission to cross the lines again and to return within 8 days. C.C. attempted to leave EINDHOVEN and to cross into the Allied lines whence he intended to proceed to ANTWERP. He did not return from this mission. Subject relates that several weeks later Oberstlt. GISKES stated that he believed that C.C. was denounced to the Allies by NELIS a former agent of FAK 307. The latter individual had met C.C. some time prior to this and was on extremely bad terms with him. NELIS had been sent into the Allied lines shortly before and had not returned from his mission. By piecing these facts together, GISKES believed that his conclusion was logical and correct.

## TRIP TO ORANIENBURG CONCENTRATION CAMP

22. At the time of arrival in HILLENRAAD no actual work was in progress and subject asked for permission to find out what had happened to the 42 agents who had been locked up in HAAREN which had, in the meantime, been overrun by the Allies. Subject proceeded to ZEIST where department IV Z had been transferred from The Hague. Here Subject learned that LAUWERS and JORDAAN had been transferred to ORANIENBURG, contrary to GISKES' promise. Subject tried to obtain permission from SCHREIEDER to see these two men, since he had a mission from GISKE to contact them and to notify them that they should contact GISKES after the war at the Gasthaus Zum Stern in ELTEN, Rhineland. GISKES intended to employ these men for postwar use. They were to ask for Dr. GERRHARDTS. A few days later Subject received a written permission from Brigadefuehrer NAUMANN, Gestapo chief in Holland, to visit the two men in ORANIENBURG. Initially, Subject was not given permission to see the two men in ORANIENBURG, because they were working on secret weapons. The following day however Subject did receive permission to see them. When Subject arrived at ORANIENBURG only JORDAAN was there, LAUWERS was supposed to have been transferred to another camp near RATHENOW. JORDAAN was in a deplorable physical and mental state. He asked Subject to let his parents know that he was still alive and asked Subject to contact him after the war at HAAGSEBERGEN near ENSCHEDE, Huis de Bleek. LAUWERS' address was in BUSSUM & WITTEBOL. Subject in turn gave JORDAAN the message from GISKES, but claims that JORDAAN immediately refused ever to contact GISKES after the war. JORDAAN furthermore stated to Subject that he would attempt to contact Lt. Col BLUNT in LONDON after the war in order to give a complete account of his actions during the German occupation. The fate of the other 40 agents is unknown to Subject, since even SCHREIEDER was unable to furnish him any information as to their whereabouts.

## AGENTS' SCHOOL

23. In mid-October 1944 Subject received the order from Oberstlt. GISKES to look for a suitable location for a possible agents' school which was to be started by FAK 307. After a prolonged search for a suitable building, the Gasthof SCHOETTLER in REBLIN, near HERSCHEID, was selected. The school was opened in the beginning of November 1944. The cadre consisted of Uffz HUNTEMANN, (Subject) and Uffz. WEIL.

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The first students arrived on or about 8 November. They were brought by Uffz. HOLLER from FAT 362. HOLLER had received these agents from a recruiter named MARCHEAL. They were 5 Frenchmen,

- a. PAUL
- b. FERNAND
- c. ROLLAND
- d. JEAN
- e. ?

After about 2 weeks JEAN and ROLLAND were found to be absolutely unsuited for this kind of work. They were returned to Uffz. HOLLER, who got them a job with the Gestapo in ERFURT. The purpose of training these agents was to send them on a mission to France, where they were to attempt to penetrate an Allied Intelligence Service and try to be parachuted back into Germany with a mission for the Allies. The training consisted of general behavior of agents and certain information about the Allied Intelligence Services.

#### WIEHL AGENTS' SCHOOL

24. Towards the end of November 1944 a more suitable location for a school was found at the LANDJAHRLAGER APPENROD near WIEHL. This building could hold about 60 people. The cadre consisted of:

- a. Rittmeister NOELLE, commanding officer
- b. Maat KUCHENBROKEN, general Abwehr instruction.
- c. Uffz WEIL, instructor in code and general behavior of agents.
- d. Uffz HUNTELMANN, instructor in behavior in case of capture, measures to escape radio detection, general camouflage of activities, acceptance of being "turned by the enemy."
- e. Oberwachtm. EICHENAUER, w/t instructor.
- f. Ogefr. HOLLER, photographer, fabricator of false identity papers.

In the beginning of December FAT 363 brought the following Belgian students to WIEHL:

- g. PIRNOLIN
- h. PEETERS
- i. ?

At the same time the following Belgians were brought to WIEHL by Hauptsturmführer MOSKOPP, liaison officer with the SS Division Wallonie:

- j. ROBERTS, former NCO in the Division Wallonie
- k. FRANCOIS, former soldier in Division Wallonie, member of the GFP, Belgium
- l. LOUIS, former soldier in Division Wallonie, member of the GFP, Belgium.
- m. MARIAN, w/t operator, former soldier in Division Wallonie

In addition to that 5 or 6 other men were brought in, but they were immediately turned down as totally unsuited for the work. They were then transferred to another school of one of the 100 Truppen (straight espionage). Uffz. HOLLER from FAT 362 brought in a number of French students who were picked out from PPF members by KUCHENBECKER in MUSTADT. Their names are:

- n. DANIEL, former French test pilot, Gestapo informer in MUNICH.
- o. CLAUDE, German agent in North Africa, Gestapo informer
- p. GILLES, Gestapo informer in MUNICH

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- q. JACQUES, professional boxer and owner of a brothel in France.
- r. ROBERT, PPF member.
- s. PIERRE, former agent of Abwehr II (sabotage) in Normandy.
- t. MARCEL
- u. GILBERT
- v. ALBERT

In early December GISKES brought a few more agents to WIEHL, names are:

- w. WILLEMIJNS, former lawyer and agent of FAT 364 in GHENT
- x. GEOFFREY, former SS Wallonie
- y. WILLIAN, former SS Wallonie
- z. NERO, former sailor on a German minesweeper, Belgian national
- aa. BAUER, German chemical student from XANTEN.

TRAINING

25. All students were instructed in the Playfair code, general code procedure, use of mail boxes, use of pigeons, w/t and anti-detection measures, how to approach the allied intelligence services and how to penetrate, how to gain the confidence of the Allies, how to act when captured, and general behavior of an agent behind the allied lines.

ARDENNES BREAKTHROUGH.

26. On 18 December 1944 Uffz. SCHLEISS of FAT 363 called for the following agents to be committed in BELGIUM:

- a. FIRMCLIN (MIC case 1808)
- b. PEETERS (MIC case 1792)
- c. ?

The same day FAT 396 M called for the following agents:

- d. PIERRE
- e. FERNAND
- f. MARCEL
- g. GILBERT

The only one who returned from this group to WIEHL was PIERRE who was picked up in BONN towards the end of January 1945. He related that GILBERT had been killed by artillery, that FERNAND had had enough and had been returned to MARSHAL in ERURT, that MARCEL had remained with FAT 396, and that he himself had never been committed but had just waited around for a possible mission.

WATERLOO MISSION

27. Another group was being trained for a special mission in Belgium, consisting of the following members:

- a. Dr. WILLEMIJNS, leader
- b. MARIAN, w/t operator
- c. WILLIAN (MIC case 1794)
- d. GEOFFREY (MIC case 1795)
- e. NERO (MIC case 1793)

The group refused to be committed with WILLEMIJNS because he was too talkative, and for that reason he was transferred to the Gestapo in STUTTGART. A new leader, ROBERTS, was selected, but the latter could not get along with MARIAN the w/t operator and insisted in having a w/t friend of his, and member of the Division Wallonie, MINEEH, join the troupe. The school got in touch with

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MOSKOPF who promptly sent ATNEEH to WIEHL. It was then later decided to send ROBERTS and ATNEEH on a separate mission, and to commit the WATERLOO group, under joint command of WILLIAM and GEOFFREY. The tactical situation deteriorated to such an extent that it was decided not to parachute the men into Belgium but to send them instead to FAT 363 in BONN and to have them pose as liberated foreign workers and thus be evacuated through DPC channels to Belgium. Subject claims to be ignorant of their mission, since WIEHL was only the training school and the missions were handed out by the L.T.s.

LIQUIDATION OF SCHOOL IN WIEHL.

28. In the beginning of March 1945 it was decided to dissolve the school in WIEHL, since the tactical situation did not warrant further training of agents. The following personalities were returned to the Division Wallonia:

- a. ROBERTS
- b. ATNEEH
- c. FRANCOIS
- d. LOUIS

Two members of the French personnel asked for permission to get in touch with PPF headquarters, (which is supposed to be located at present on an island in the BODENSEE). They intended to go on their own and to try to join the Maquis Blanc. Their names are:

- e. HOBERT
- f. PIERRE

Two weeks prior to this another Frenchman, DANIEL, was sent back to the PPF because he was not trusted by the personnel. He carried a sealed envelope containing a letter stating that he was unreliable and that he should be arrested.

NORA MISSION

29. At the last minute another group of Frenchmen was organized to act as penetration agents in France. These men were sent to WUPPERTAL, where they were to pose as liberated foreign workers. In WUPPERTAL they were to try to be evacuated to France where they were to penetrate the allied intelligence services. Their names are:

- a. CLAUDE, leader and w/t operator
- b. GILLES
- c. JACQUES

They were transferred to FAT 363 and received instructions to live separately in WUPPERTAL to try and live with some girl and to be completely ignorant of each other's existence. They were to attempt to smuggle their w/t set into France.

FATE OF REMAINDER OF STUDENTS.

30. The following students still remained in "WIEHL":

- a. PAUL
- b. ALBERT
- c. BAUER
- d. OLGA

PAUL and ALBERT got a large quantity of food and intended to return to France, posing as innocent foreign workers. They do not have a mission at the present time. BAUER and OLGA (a Flemish girl who had joined the school only a few days before, after having been trained as w/t operator by the SS Jagdverband

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Nord West) were sent together with Rittmeister NOELLE to NEHEMIAH HUESTEN where a very small school was to be continued. Rittmeister NOELLE became seriously ill, and Subject does not know what became of B.UER and OLG..

HEERESGRUPPE:

30. As soon as the forces in the RUHR were surrounded, the personnel of the LX and LAT was ordered to infiltrate in groups of three and in German uniform behind the American lines, to obtain identification papers and dogtags of some lone American soldier who, if necessary, was to be killed. Subject did not like this kind of assignment at all and therefore contacted an old friend of his, Oberstlt MICHAEL, Ic of Heeresgruppe B. About two days later MICHAEL saw to it that Subject got a transfer to the Heeresgruppe B where Subject acted as MICHAEL's clerk. He remained with the headquarters of the Heeresgruppe until the collapse of the RUHR pocket and then surrendered to the American forces on 13 or 14 April 1945 in LIJEDENSCHIED.

COMMENTS.

31. Subject is a middle aged man, with an intelligence considered to be far above average. He has lived for several years in foreign countries, and speaks English, French, Dutch and Spanish. Possibly because of his former foreign background, Subject has never actually believed in National Socialism, and has never belonged to the party or affiliated organizations. He is an export merchant by profession and realizes that Germany can only exist as a peaceful nation by trading with the world as an equal and not as a superior. Subject has been extremely active in the Abwehr in Holland and figured as one of the key personalities in the Nordpol case. For two full years he has concentrated all his efforts on this case and has performed an unusually great service to the CIS. In 1944 Subject began to realize that Germany could never win this war and probably as a result of this began to change his attitude. Subject's actions in the DACIER case are a first indication in this direction. He is extremely anxious to have DACIER contacted by the Allies in order to be used as a character witness in his favor. A second indication of Subject's change of attitude is his trip to ORANIENBURG where he intended to contact LAUVERS and JOHANAN. Subject surrendered to American forces in civilian clothing on 13 or 14 April 1945 in LIJEDENSCHIED and immediately volunteered a tremendous amount of information. His attitude during interrogation at this Center could be termed extremely helpful and cooperative. The information, as supplied by Subject, was partially checked with the available records and proved to be correct. It is believed that Subject's statements are reliable. Subject gives the following explanation for his cooperative attitude and for the fact that he volunteered to help us find GISKES and Uffz. KUP:

a. He is an anti-Nazi and a believer in democracy, and sincerely wants to cooperate with the Allies to help stamp out the CIS and thus prevent a new war 25 years hence.

b. He is engaged and intends to marry the daughter of Rittmeister MICHAEL who is 17 years younger. Under the existing NUERNBERG laws such a marriage is impossible.

c. He is now 44 years of age, without capital and without future. He hopes to gain the favor of the Allies and possibly to be enabled to get an opportunity to participate actively in some official function in an Allied-controlled Germany.

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It is believed that Subject should be given the opportunity of helping us find Oberstlt GISKES and Uffz: KUP, both instrumental personalities in FAK 307. It is further believed that Subject could be used in identifying many prominent personalities who have formerly been active in the Abwehr, and who will now try either to go underground or to be evacuated as innocent line soldiers. It was not possible to interrogate Subject fully on all details of his past experiences, and it is believed that he should be evacuated to higher headquarters for further detailed interrogation. In summing up this case generally, it should be mentioned that Subject, who himself is an expert in penetration technique, may now try to penetrate personally the Allied Intelligence Service. It is therefore recommended that, should he ever be used, he be watched extremely closely for a long time, since he may try to carry out several missions successfully in order to gain our confidence.

## FORMATION OF FAKs AND FATS.

2. In March 1944 the entire Abwehr was reorganized. Almost all personnel of III F and III G were formed into Kommandos and Trupps. FAK 307 was active in Holland, Belgium and Northern France and consisted of FAT 362, 363, 364, 365. FAK 306 was formed in Southern France and consisted of several Trupps of which only 396 M is definitely known to Subject. After the fall of France this was again reorganized as follows: FAK 306 was transferred to Holland and F.A.T 365 was assigned to it. FAK 307 was transferred to Germany and assigned the sector from Holland to BONN. It now consisted of F.A.T 362, 363, 364 and 396 M. F.A.T 362 is probably the only unit that managed to escape from the Ruhr pocket. F.A.T 363 was in a little village about 3 Km from GUMMERSBACH. F.A.T 364 was last located in LEICHLINGEN near SOLINGEN.

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Location of FAK 396 K is unknown to Subject. FAK 307 was last located in HUEINGHAUSEN near REERSCHIED. FAK 306 and STELLE P were last located in BORCULO near ENSCHEDE, Holland.

CLAUDIUS NET

4. In early November 1944 GISKES intended to organize a net of stay-behind w/t agents. He instructed Lt SIEGERS to go to a Nachrichten Elferinnen School in the vicinity of WURFURT to look for possible agents. Lt SIEGERS returned with 10 girls, to be trained by FAK 307. The girls got about three weeks of instruction and were then tested as to their suitability. It was immediately determined that none of them had any agent's qualities and it was decided to abandon the project. 7 girls were transferred as signal personnel to the Leitstelle West, while 3 girls were retained in a similar capacity in FAK 307.

NET OF W/T AGENTS ON EAST BANK OF RHINE

5. GISKES ordered Uffz OEWETTER and Wachtm KUNZLICH to organize a net of stay-behind w/t agents in the area east of the Rhine. GISKES furthermore specified that they had to coordinate all activities with WESTEROP, alias DR JUSTENDOOP, canned food manufacturer with factories in DUESSELDORF, SCHAIKSMUIJLE, BREDA, Holland and in French North Africa. WESTEROP is a personal friend of GISKES, and although he has never officially worked for the Abwehr, Subject believes that he has been one of GISKES' personal agents. WESTEROP was to be the chief of this proposed net of w/t agents, and also to act as recruiter in DUESSELDORF and vicinity. The activities of this net were not merely limited to w/t sets, but pigeons were to be used for communication purposes. This plan was never carried out, because the tactical situation deteriorated to such an extent that effective training of agents was no longer practicable. WESTEROP, however, is a person who is definitely regarded as dangerous and whose activities during the past four years should be very closely investigated.

ATTEMPTS BY ABWEHR PERSONNEL TO CAMOUFLAGE THEIR IDENTITY

6. The important members of the FAKs and FAKs will all be in possession of a great number of false identity papers which will enable them to decide upon a suitable course whenever the situation arises. Some will attempt, with the aid of false Soldbuch and Wehrpass, to appear as harmless soldiers, others will try to pose as normal citizens who have never had any function in the German army. All Soldbuch with the real identification (Dienststelle 04417, replacement unit Ers. Br 600, LISSA) were collected and new Soldbuch issued. Oberfeldwebel SCHWÄGELER, who was captured on 14 April in LUEDENSCHIED, has personally made out these new Soldbuch and will be able to supply this highly important information with regard to those specific details that are to be noticed in these newly issued identifications.

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#### RADIO DETECTION AND INTERCEPTION.

7. Radio detection and interception was organized differently in various countries. In Germany proper the OKW WNW Fu existed, with its headquarters in STAHLHORN near BERLIN. In Belgium this mission was performed by the Funkueberwachungs Kp. 615 and 616. It is believed that these two units are part of the OKW WNW Fu. In Holland and in some parts of France the radio interception and detection was carried out by "B Stellen" of the Orpo. In the event of the establishment of a fake radio link with England, this communication was performed by the Orpo in Holland and by the Funkueberwachungskp in Belgium.

#### COOPERATION BETWEEN ABWEHR AND SD IN HOLLAND

8. In Holland, fairly good cooperation existed between the SD (Gestapo IV E) and the Abwehr III. This was mainly due to the personal understanding between the two leaders, GISKES and SCHREIEDER. The SD had to be notified in all cases of certain leads which might possibly help detect underground activities. The Abwehr could work on a case, but did not have the right to carry out any arrests. Neither was it allowed for the Abwehr members to interrogate the SD prisoners. Sometimes SCHREIEDER allowed GISKES in unusual cases to have one of his men talk to a prisoner, but solely concerning military matters. The SD had the right to keep all its cases and to do with them as they deemed fit. In several instances however, the Abwehr was permitted to use some of these agents after they had been "turned". This does not mean that all "turned" agents were handled by the Abwehr, since many cases remained under immediate control of the SD. As a matter of fact, the Abwehr was completely ignorant of any details of such cases. Thus in Holland the rather odd situation existed that the Abwehr III was more or less the "brains" of the counterespionage organization, that the SD carried out most of the executive functions and that the Orpo was responsible for radio communication and interception.

#### COOPERATION BETWEEN ABWEHR AND SD IN BELGIUM.

9. The situation in Belgium was somewhat different. If the Abwehr III investigated a case, it always tried to have it solved by army personnel and for that reason most arrests were carried out by the GFP. This, however, was not possible in all cases since the SD often had more complete files on personalities than the Abwehr. In such cases a man was arrested and interrogated by the SD. After incorporation of the GFP into the SD in 1944, all cases were thenceforth handled by the SD.

#### RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN MIL AMT AND LEITSTELLE WEST

10. It is very difficult to determine the exact relationship between the Leitstelle III West (which is in charge of all the 300 series) and the Mil Amt (Amt VIII RSHA). The Leitstelle West was attached to Oberbefehlshaber West. From this headquarters they received purely military missions which were then distributed to the FAKs and FATS. From the Mil Amt, the Leitstelle received instructions regarding general policies, such as creation of schools, recruitment of agents, special long range missions etc. No exact information could be obtained from Subject, but the above explanation seems plausible.

#### KNOWLEDGE ABOUT ALLIED INTELLIGENCE SERVICES.

11. A monthly bulletin is issued by the Leitstelle West giving full details about the activities of French, Belgian, Dutch, US and British, Polish and Russian agencies. The Belgian Intelligence is considered the most dangerous one. The Germans have a rather extensive knowledge of the British Intelligence and know

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many details about personalities, recruitment, schools, etc. The knowledge of US agencies is not as extensive. Subject declares that he was not very much interested in this respect and for that reason cannot furnish many details. He is certain however that the Germans have a fairly accurate picture of the Allied intelligence agencies.

KNOWLEDGE ABOUT INVASION PLANS.

12. Subject stated that as far as he knows the Germans did not have any advance knowledge as to the time and sector of an Allied invasion of the continent. In this respect Subject relates that GISKES believed as much as two weeks after 6 June 1944 that the Normandy invasion was merely a faint and that a full scale invasion would be attempted in Norway.

In spite of his low rank, he should be able to provide us with valuable information, as he has been actively concerned, probably since 1942, with the control of Allied agents' transmitters and with the penetration of Resistance movements.
