In reply to your DCE1/KB/5038 dated 15 Mar 43, the code name NETBALL covers the operation for despatching ROBLEVELD, a W/T operator, to the field.

From: M

a Dutch wireless operator (NETBALL) will be going to the field to a Reception Committee in about a week's time. On the W/T.2 forms which I submitted in respect of this agent I requested that sufficient spare plans and code poems should be given to him to cover his needs for six months. The choice of the period of six months is, of course, purely arbitrary.

I was informed by D/YC.H this morning that O.C. STATION 52 objected to providing the man with spare poems on the grounds of security. I would now like to confirm my conversation with MS/A on this subject in which I pointed out

- a) that the agent in question is going to a Reception Committee and can, if necessary, leave any written matter which he does not care to carry about with him with this Committee
- b) that if spare plans and poems are not taken by the agent himself they would have to be sent with a container operation to the same Reception Committee and passed to him by hand through various intermediaries. This is an undertaking which we naturally wish to avoid.

I ventured to suggest to MS/A that the question of whether an agent should take spare plans and poems with him, or whether these should be sent to him afterwards, was a matter for the Country Section to decide after consideration of the circumstances of the agent's work in the field and of the requirements of MS Section.

I understand that MS/A agrees that in this case at least the operation should go on as requested in our W/T form, and would respectfully ask you to take the necessary action.
