ARRESTED DUTCH SOE AGENTS

In September 1944 N/A and N/T.1 interviewed a French agent - Capt. ROUSSET who had escaped from the prison camp at RAVICZ, Silesia, North-west of BRESLAU on 12 May 44. While in detention there from 19 Apr to 12 May he saw at least 50 Dutchmen among the prisoners. Some of these he identified from photographs shown him by N/A and their names are as follows :-

The three agents marked with a query are doubtful but are believed to be there, though in an emaciated condition which makes recognition from photographs difficult.

As the Russian forces are approaching RAVICZ, if they have not already arrived, it is felt that they should be advised of our interest in these prisoners, possibly through our German and Russian sections, so that we might be informed should any of them be rescued. Also the agents would receive proper treatment immediately and not get into difficulties with the rescuing forces through being unable to explain their position satisfactorily.

Major SHIMOUR of "C" also interrogated Capt. ROUSSET with regard to C agents who might also be imprisoned at RAVICZ and showed him photographs.

All agents if asked who they knew in London with the exception of Lauwers, should state the following - Capt. (or major) Bingham, Captain Lieftuck, Capt. Knight and Miss Bond. Lauwers would have Captain Lanning, Dick Lanning, Frank Dawson, Major Lt. Lacoe & Capt. Gould, known - R.V. Lanning.
